3 **Resolution reappointing Christine Ma, M.D., term ending October 21, 2015, to the Local**
4 **Homeless Coordinating Board, residency requirement waived.**

5
6 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
7 does hereby re-appoint the hereinafter Controller's designated person to serve as a member
8 of the Local Homeless Coordinating Board, pursuant to the provisions of Resolution Nos. 827-
9 97, 926-99, 729-01 and 208-05, for a four-year term expiring October 21, 2015:

10 Christine Ma, M.D., (residency waiver requested), succeeding herself, term expired,
11 seat 9, must be a representative of homeless or formerly homeless, community advocacy
12 organizations, service-provider agencies, business and corporate sectors or the foundation
13 community, for a four-year term expiring October 21, 2015; and be it

14 FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 15 1. The membership of the Local Homeless Coordination Board has a goal to be
16 representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- 17 2. Applicant Christine Ma, M.D., an appointee, who is not a resident of San
18 Francisco, is a person with experience that uniquely qualifies her to serve on the
19 Local Homeless Coordinating Board.
- 20 3. The Controller has attempted to fill the position, for which Christine Ma M.D.,
21 was nominated, with an individual who is a City resident and who has the
22 specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at
23 this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Christine Ma, M.D., is qualified
24 to serve on the Local Homeless Coordinating Board.
- 25 4. After exercising due diligence, the Controller concludes that there is no other

1 possible representative, who is a resident of San Francisco and who has the
2 specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this applicant, and who
3 is willing to serve on the Local Homeless Coordinating Board at this time, and,
4 be it

5 FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors waives the residency
6 requirement for Christine Ma, M.D., as allowed in cases where no qualified City
7 resident, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to Section 4.101 of the City Charter
8 that requires person(s) appointed to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies
9 established by legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City
10 and County of San Francisco.

I have served as a member of the Local Homeless Coordinating Board since 2005, and have been the co-chair for the past two years. I have been working in the area of health care for the homeless in San Francisco since 1993, focusing on homeless children and families since 1999. As a pediatrician, I have been running a homeless clinic at Children's Hospital Oakland since 2007. In addition, I am the Medical Director for Kerry's Kids, a non-profit mobile health clinic serving homeless, uninsured and underserved children in shelters and community centers. In 2001, as a faculty member at UCSF, I helped to start a curriculum on teaching pediatric residents about health issues that homeless families face; I currently continue to assist with this curriculum as a volunteer faculty member in the UCSF Department of Pediatrics.

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
