3 Ordinance amending the San Francisco Administrative Code Section 2A.22.1 to revise
4 and increase the fees charged to City administered or City funded construction
5 projects for plan review and site inspection by the Mayor's Office on Disability for
6 compliance with federal disability access laws; and making environmental findings and
7 findings of consistency with the General Plan.

12 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

13 Section 1. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in
14 this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public
15 Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the
16 Board of Supervisors in File No. 120606 and is incorporated herein by reference.

17 Section 2. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by amending
18 Section 2A.22.1, to read as follows:

19 **SEC. 2A.22.1. MAYOR'S OFFICE ON DISABILITY PLAN REVIEW AND SITE**
20 **INSPECTION FEES.**

21 Any city administered or funded construction project requiring the Mayor's Office on
22 Disability plan review or site inspection for compliance with Federal disability access laws and
23 regulations shall pay a fee consistent with this section. For the purpose of this section, "plan
24 review" includes reviewing and approving architectural drawings, site plans, and construction
25 plans for compliance with Federal disability access laws and regulations prior to the

1 commencement of work. For the purpose of this section, "site inspection" includes inspecting
 2 and approving all work for compliance with Federal disability access laws and regulations
 3 during the construction phase of the project.

4 (a) Plan Review and Site Inspection Fees. At the time the project sponsor submits its
 5 architectural drawings, site plans, and construction plans to the Mayor's Office on Disability,
 6 the project sponsor shall pay to the Mayor's Office on Disability a fee as set forth below.

For the purposes of this section, "Total Project Valuation of the project" shall mean the amount as determined under San Francisco Building Code Section 107.2. In the absence of a waiver under subsection (b), this ordinance does not require the Mayor's Office on Disability shall

1. ~~not be required~~ to review the architectural drawings, site plans, and construction plans or
2. conduct any site inspections until the project sponsor pays the fee established by this section.


3. (b) Waiver. The Director of the Office on Disability may waive the fees received under
4. this section where the project sponsor demonstrates in a written application that payment of
5. such fees would present an undue financial hardship on the project sponsor.

6. (c) Adjustment of fees by the Controller. No later than July 1st of each year, the Controller
7. shall adjust the fee schedule to ensure that: (1) each fee produces sufficient revenue to support each fee
8. category's costs for the next year, and (2) each fee does not produce revenue which is projected to
9. materially exceed each fee category's costs for the next year. The Controller shall provide a copy of
10. any adjusted fee schedule under this Section 2A.22.1 to the Mayor's Office on Disability. The Mayor's
11. Office on Disability shall post the adjusted fee schedule on its website. The Controller's annual
12. adjustment shall become operative on July 1st of each year.

13. Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days from the
14. date of passage.

15. Section 4. This section is uncodified. In enacting this Ordinance, the Board intends to
16. amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers,
17. punctuation, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent part of the Administrative Code that
18. are explicitly shown in this legislation as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions,
19. and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official
20. title of the legislation.

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - Plan Review and Site Inspection to Ensure Compliance with Federal Disability Laws Fee]

Ordinance amending the San Francisco Administrative Code Section 2A.22.1 to revise and increase the fees charged to City administered or City funded construction projects for plan review and site inspection by the Mayor's Office on Disability for compliance with federal disability access laws; and making environmental findings and findings of consistency with the General Plan.

Existing Law

Under Section 2A.22.1 of the San Francisco Administrative Code, the Mayor's Office on Disability ("MOD") charges fees for its plan review and site inspection of City administered and City funded construction projects.

Amendments to Current Law

This Ordinance would revise and increase the fees for the MOD's plan review and site inspection services to help cover the costs of such services. Specifically, the new fee structure would provide standard fees for standard services based on the cost of the project. Further, the new fee structure provides hourly charges for projects that require supplemental plan review and site inspections. This Ordinance would also require the Controller to adjust the fee annually to ensure cost recovery.

Background Information

The MOD has an architectural access program for plan review and field inspection to ensure that all City construction projects and any City funded construction projects, are accessible to and usable by persons with disabilities, consistent with applicable disability access laws, including the Americans with Disabilities Act. This program includes construction projects that receive public funding administered by the City of San Francisco through the Mayor's Office on Housing, the former Redevelopment Agency, and other City Departments including Public Health and the Human Services Agency among others. According to the MOD, the current fee structure does not cover the actual costs of performing the plan and site reviews.

If the Ordinance passes, it would authorize an increase to the current fees for the Mayor's Office on Disability Plan Review and Site Inspection as follows:

Fee Schedule - New Construction:
Project Valuations up to \$200,000; Fee: Hourly Rate of \$150/hr. Includes two Plan Reviews and two Site Inspections; Additional Plan Review or Site Inspections - \$150/hr.

Project Valuations \$200,000-\$999,999; Fee: \$2,200 + \$310 per each additional \$100,000 over the initial \$200,000; includes three Plan Reviews and three Site Inspections; Additional Plan Review or Site Inspections - \$150.

Project Valuations \$1,000,000-\$5,000,000; Fee: \$4,400 + \$75 per each additional \$100,000 over the initial \$1,000,000; includes three Plan Reviews and our Site inspections; Additional Plan Review or Site Inspections - \$150/hr.

Project Valuations \$5,000,000-\$10,000,000; Fee: \$7,400 + \$22 per each additional \$100,000 over the initial \$5,000,000; includes three Plan Reviews and five Site Inspections; Additional Plan Review or Site Inspections - \$150/hr.

Project Valuations \$10,000,000 and up; Fee: \$8,500 + \$13.50 per each additional \$100,000 over the initial \$10,000,000; includes three Plan Reviews and nine Site Inspections; Additional Plan Review or Site Inspections - \$150/hr.

Fee Schedule - Alterations:
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Project Valuations \$200,000-\$999,999; Fee: \$2,640 + \$340 per each additional \$100,000 over the initial \$200,000; includes three Plan Reviews and three Site Inspections; Additional Plan Review or Site Inspections - \$150/hr.

Project Valuations \$1,000,000-\$5,000,000; Fee: \$5,040 + \$85 per each additional \$100,000 over the initial \$1,000,000; includes three Plan Re-

views and our Site inspections; Additional Plan Review or Site Inspections - \$150/hr.

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No later than July 1st of each year, the Controller shall adjust the fee schedule to ensure that: 1) each fee produces sufficient revenues to support each fee category's costs for the next year; and 2) each fee does not produce revenue which is projected to materially exceed each fee category's cost for the next year. The Controller's annual adjustment shall become operative on July 1st of each year.

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

Controller's Discussion of the Mayor's FY 2012-13 and 2013-14 Proposed Budget June 14, 2012

Charter Section 9.102 requires that the Controller provide the Board of Supervisors with an opinion regarding the accuracy of economic assumptions underlying the revenue estimates in the Mayor's Proposed Budget and the reasonableness of such estimates. On May 31, 2012, Mayor Edwin Lee submitted his FY 2012-13 and FY 2013-14 Proposed Budget to the Board of Supervisors. An overview of the revenues is provided in Table 1.

Overall, the proposed two-year budget appears to be reasonable given the information currently available. The proposed budget reduces the City's recent reliance on one-time revenues and includes a gradual rebuilding of reserves, reducing prospective budgetary shortfalls, provided that the current economic recovery is sustained and potential future reductions in State revenues remain manageable.

Overview

As shown in Table 1, the Proposed Budget for FY 2012-13 of \$3.5 billion General Fund and \$7.3 billion All Funds represents a 7% increase from the FY 2011-12 original budget. The Proposed Budget for FY 2013-14 represents a further 3% increase in both General Fund and All Funds. Highlights include:

- **Local tax revenue estimates are reasonable given current economic assumptions but will continue to be monitored.** The proposed budget reflects the prevailing economic consensus in assuming a steady economic recovery through FY 2012-13 and FY 2013-14, with regular revenues increasing by \$220 million over the FY 2011-12 budget (representing \$92 million above the revised FY 2011-12 revenue outlook in the Controller's Nine Month Budget Status Report), and FY 2013-14 revenues increasing by a further \$109 million. However, San Francisco's economy is vulnerable to national and international economic developments that could cause changes to the currently favorable trends in job growth, property values and tourism. Any significant economic slowdown would require the Mayor's Office and Board to adjust the budget to reflect reduced revenues. The Controller's Office will monitor local tax receipts and the overall economic outlook carefully and provide revenue projection updates throughout the budget years.
