Resolution requesting the Planning Department to develop a white paper and set of design guidelines for family-friendly housing in the City.

[Request for a White Paper - Design Guidelines for Family-Friendly Housing]

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Planning Department ("Planning Department")'s mission is to shape the future of San Francisco and the region by generating a vision for the General Plan and neighborhood plans and fostering exemplary design through planning controls; and

WHEREAS, The population of children under the age of 5 is increasing from 37,890 in 2000 to 41,340 in 2010; and

WHEREAS, The number of family households in San Francisco is growing and approximately 56,940 or 37% of family households include children; and

WHEREAS, The housing accessibility and affordability are top factors that families cite as disincentives to live in the City; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors approved the 2015 Housing Element on March 24, 2015, which included a recommendation to develop a common definition for family housing; and

WHEREAS, The 2006 Working Group on Housing-Related Retention Policies recommended that the City create a measurable plan for closing the Family Housing Gap and to ensure that neighborhood plans provide a minimum of family-friendly housing; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors requests that the Planning Department develop a white-paper that seeks to identify the characteristics and amenities of family-friendly

housing and provide recommendations regarding the City's policy in encouraging future development; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors requests the Planning Department, in collaboration with stakeholders, develop a comprehensive set of design guidelines for family-friendly housing in San Francisco; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors requests the Planning
Department to create an outreach plan and establish a working group of stakeholders,
including, but not limited to, family advocates, housing experts, and housing developers to be
included in the process within one month of approval of this resolution; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors requests that the preliminary draft of the white paper and the design guidelines be submitted to the Board of Supervisors, after approval of this resolution, in four months and the final versions be presented in nine months.
