[Supporting California State Senate Bill 1286 (Leno) - Increasing Law Enforcement

accountability by allowing the public to access information on police misconduct and

use of force.

WHEREAS, Police departments and law enforcement agencies across America have for years, closely guarded information relating to misconduct, use of force, and stop data; and

WHEREAS, To increase accountability, improve public trust of law enforcement and promote informed participation by the public, specific data must be accessible to the public and available online in an open format; and

WHEREAS, Polling data shows that nearly 80% of Californians believe the public should have access to the findings of police misconduct; and

WHEREAS, Many states including Texas, Kentucky, Utah, and several others, already make police misconduct information available to the public when an allegation of misconduct has been confirmed; and

WHEREAS, At least ten other states, including Florida, Ohio, and Washington, also make these same records public regardless of whether an incident of misconduct has been confirmed; and

WHEREAS, In February, California Senate Bill (SB) 1286, introduced by Senator Mark Leno would improve transparency, accountability, and trust between law enforcement and the public; and

WHEREAS, SB 1286 would allow greater public access to peace officer records related to serious uses of force and sustained charges of misconduct; and

WHEREAS, SB 1286 also gives members of the public who file complaints alleging misconduct access to information related to those complaints, while also providing protections for officers from frivolous and oppressive complaints from members of the public; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors have already taken action locally to create more transparency into law enforcement by unanimously passing the transparent policing and data collection ordinance in September, 2015 and moving a ballot measure forward to the voters requiring independent investigations into all officer involved shootings in March, 2016; and

WHEREAS, SB 1286 aims to balance the needs of public disclosure and individual privacy by allowing courts to withhold records if there is a risk or danger to an officer or another person; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors declares their support for SB 1286, and urges the Senate and Assembly to pass this bill; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit copies of this resolution to Senator Mark Leno with a request to take all actions necessary to achieve the objectives of SB 1286.
