11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

13	Section 1. The Police Code is hereby amended by revising Section 4512, to read as	
14	follows:	
15	SEC. 4512. $ extit{HANDGUNS}$ $ extit{FIREARMS}$ LOCATED IN $ extit{ANY}$ RESIDENCE TO BE KEPT	
16	IN A LOCKED CONTAINER OR DISABLED WITH A TRIGGER LOCK.	
17	(a) Prohibition. No person shall keep a handgun firearm within any residence owned o	
18	controlled by that person unless the firearm handgun is stored in a locked container or disabled	
19	with a trigger lock. that has been approved by the California Department of Justice.	
20	(b) Definitions. As used in this Section 4512, the following terms have the following	
21	meaning:	
22	— (1) "Firearm" means a Firearm as defined in California Penal Code, Section 16520, as	
23	amended from time to time.

1	Residence. As used in this Section, means—residence—is any structure intended or used for
2	human habitation including but not limited to houses, condominiums, rooms, in law units, motels,
3	hotels, SRO's, time-shares, recreational and other vehicles where human habitation occurs.
4	(2) "Locked container." means a locked container as defined in California Penal Code,
5	Section 16850, as amended from time to time and is listed on the California Department of Justice
6	Bureau of Firearms roster of approved firearm safety devices. As used in this Section, "locked
7	container" means a secure container which is fully enclosed and locked by a padlock, key lock,
8	combination lock or similar locking device.
9	(3) "Handgun." As used in this Section, "handgun" means any pistol, revolver, or other firearn
10	that is capable of being concealed upon the person, designed to be used as a weapon, capable of
11	expelling a projectile by the force of any explosion or other form of combustion, and has a barrel less
12	than 16 inches in length.
13	"Residence" means any structure intended or used for human habitation, including but not
14	limited to houses, condominiums, rooms, in-law units, motels, hotels, SRO's, time shares, and
15	recreational and other vehicles where human habitation occurs.
16	(4) "Trigger lock." As used in this Section, means a "trigger lock" means a trigger lock that
17	is listed $\frac{\partial n}{\partial t}$ the California Department of Justice's $\frac{\partial n}{\partial t}$ of approved firearms safety
18	devices and that is identified as appropriate for that <u>firearm</u> handgun by reference to either the
19	manufacturer and model of the <i>firearm</i> , <i>handgun</i> or to the physical characteristics of the <i>firearm</i>
20	handgun that match those listed on the roster for use with the device under Penal Code
21	<u>S</u> section <u>23635</u> . <u>12088(d).</u>
22	(c) Exceptions. This Section <u>4512</u> shall not apply in the following circumstances:
23	(1) The handgun firearm is carried on the person of an individual in accordance
24	with all applicable laws.over the age of 18.

(2)	The <i>handgun firearm</i> is under the control of a person who is a peace office
under Penal Cod	le Section 830 et seq.

- (d) **Lost or Stolen** *Firearms Handguns*. In order to encourage reports to law enforcement agencies of lost or stolen *firearms handguns* pursuant to *San Francisco* Police Code Section 616, a person who files a report with a law enforcement agency notifying the agency that a *firearm handgun* has been lost or stolen shall not be subject to prosecution for violation of Section 4512(a) above.
- (e) **Penalty.** Every violation of this Section <u>4512</u> shall constitute a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$1,000.00 or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed six months, or by both.
- (f) **Severability.** If any provision, clause or word of this chapter or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any other provision, clause, word or application of this Section <u>4512</u> which can be given effect without the invalid provision, clause or word, and to this end the provisions of this Section are declared to be severable.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
