SUBJECT: LEGISLATION INTRODUCED

The Board of Supervisors' Land Use and Transportation Committee has received the following proposed legislation, introduced by Supervisor Wiener on September 13, 2016:

File No. 160985

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to require that the procurement of Fire Vehicles consider maneuverability on narrow streets as at least 20% of the scoring weight in the evaluation, establish a policy that the City will follow National Fire Protection Association standards in the replacement of Fire Vehicles, and require a report to the Board of Supervisors following execution of purchase contracts.

16 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

17 Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising Section 21.4, to
18 read as follows:

19 **SEC. 21.4. INVITATIONS FOR COMPETITIVE PROPOSALS OR QUALIFICATIONS.**

20 (* * * *)

21 (f) Fire Vehicles

22 (1) Evaluation. The Fire Department, through its department head and through the
23 Purchaser, is authorized to include among its purchasing specifications the use of negotiated
24 procurement procedures for the purchase of Fire Vehicles, which include fire engines, fire trucks, fire
25 apparatus, and other large emergency vehicles. In the evaluation stage of any procurement of a Fire
Vehicle, maneuverability on narrow streets must comprise at least 20% of the evaluation score.

1 (2) Vehicle Replacement Generally. In replacing Fire Vehicles, it shall be City policy to
2 align with standards promulgated by the National Fire Protection Association.


3 (3) Report. Within 60 days after execution of any purchasing contract for Fire Vehicles,
4 the Fire Department shall submit a report to the Board of Supervisors indicating the results of the
5 procurement, including maneuverability of selected vehicle(s) and alternatives considered.

6 (4) Urban Use. This subsection 21.4(f) applies only to Fire Vehicles intended to be used
7 primarily on City streets.

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9 Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
10 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
11 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
12 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance
