2	Desclution asknowledging the establishment of a new public benefit sivin pennsofit
3	Resolution acknowledging the establishment of a new public benefit civic nonprofit
4	Yerba Buena Gardens Conservancy to assume long-term operating and management
5	responsibility for Yerba Buena Gardens under a master lease with the City of San
6	Francisco.
7	
8	WHEREAS, In 1976 Mayor George Moscone embraced a civic vision to combine the
9	construction of a new Convention Center for the City's vital Visitor Industry with the creation
10	of a "public gardens" for the everyday enjoyment of all the residents and communities of San
11	Francisco; and
12	WHEREAS, Four decades later, thanks to the determination of the San Francisco
13	Redevelopment Agency, community advocates, committed builders, old and new arts
14	institutions, and many civic stakeholders - and after overcoming obstacles and challenges -
15	the realization of that Vision, Yerba Buena Gardens, is now nearing full completion; and
16	WHEREAS, The three Blocks of Yerba Buena Gardens are a civic treasure of
17	interrelated public parks, community institutions, and urban amenities cherished by the people
18	of San Francisco; and
19	WHEREAS, Block One of the Gardens bounded by Market, Mission, Third, and Fourth
20	Streets includes St. Patrick's Church, Jessie Square, the Contemporary Jewish Museum, the
21	Mexican Museum, and Yerba Buena Lane; and
22	WHEREAS, Block Two of the Gardens bounded by Mission, Howard, Third, and Fourth
23	Streets includes the Esplanade, the Market Luther King Memorial Fountain, the East Garden,
24	the Yerba Buena Center for the Arts Gallery and Theater, and the Sister City Gardens; and

1	WHEREAS, Block Three of the Gardens bounded by Howard, Folsom, Third, and
2	Fourth Streets includes the Playland at the Beach Carousel, the Children's Playground, the
3	Children's Creativity Center, the Skating/Bowling Center, and the (South of Market) SOMA
4	Childcare Center; and
5	WHEREAS, The Gardens also include several popular cafes and public art works
6	enjoyed by its visitors, and is adjacent to the Museum of African Diaspora and San Francisco
7	Filipino Cultural Center and the busy Metreon Entertainment/Shopping complex; and
8	WHEREAS, The Gardens host an exceptional range of annual public free events and
9	celebrations, including the Yerba Buena Gardens Festival performances, the annual Martin
10	Luther King Holiday Birthday Observance, and the annual Pistahan Festival; and
11	WHEREAS, The Gardens also host a number of well-coordinated Moscone Convention
12	Center events each year for the engagement of convention attendees; and
13	WHEREAS, Since its opening in 1992 the Gardens and its many attractions have been
14	shared and enjoyed by City residents and visitors from around the world, with over 5,000,000
15	enjoying its many amenities in 2015 alone; and
16	WHEREAS, The finishing touches of Yerba Buena Gardens are now under
17	construction, including a new Tot Lot, a new Howard Street Pedestrian Bridge, and additional
18	Gardens improvements that are part of the Moscone Center Expansion Project that will be
19	completed in 2018; and
20	WHEREAS, As required by State Law, the City will assume ownership of all the
21	Gardens properties and buildings in 2017, and will assume responsibility for the management
22	and maintenance of the Gardens from the San Francisco Office of Community Improvement
23	and Infrastructure (OCII) that point forward; and
24	WHEREAS, The former Redevelopment Agency's agreements with the Marriot Hotel,

the Metreon, the St. Regis Hotel, and Millennium Partners to fund the Gardens annual

1	Maintenance, Operating, and Security costs will continue in effect, now totaling about
2	\$8,900,000 per year; and
3	WHEREAS, The rental income from the Skating/Bowling Center, B Restaurant, and
4	Samovar Tea Lounge also will continue, adding about \$700,000 per year in payments to OCII;
5	and
6	WHEREAS, These and other revenues provide over \$9,600,000 a year for the
7	maintenance and operation of the Gardens parks and public amenities; and
8	WHEREAS, These revenues also provide about \$4,000,000 a year for the
9	maintenance and operation of the Gardens cultural facilities; and
10	Whereas, additional revenues of about \$1,000,000 per year from temporary rentals of
11	Gardens spaces and facilities supports extensive programming of free public events and
12	activities in the Gardens; and
13	WHEREAS, There is about \$13,000,000 in reserves now held by OCII for future
14	operating expenses, building renovation needs, and long-range capital improvements of the
15	Gardens; and
16	WHEREAS, The ground lease payments from the City's Moscone Convention Center
17	of about \$600,000 per year helped support maintenance and operation of the Gardens parks
18	and public amenities ended in 2015; and
19	WHEREAS, The Gardens is projected to need approximately \$50,000,000 in capital
20	funding over the next 30 years for routine renovation of all its building and facilities subject to
21	validation by the San Francisco Real Estate Division; now, therefore, be it
22	RESOLVED, That it is the Policy of the City and County of San Francisco that it is now
23	time to establish a new public benefit civic nonprofit Yerba Buena Gardens Conservancy to
24	assume long-term operating and management responsibility for Yerba Buena Gardens under

a master lease with the City and County of San Francisco; and

1	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Yerba Buena Gardens Conservancy will be
2	governed by a 15 member Board of Directors composed of 9 Gardens stakeholders elected
3	by the Conservancy board and 6 civic leaders 3 appointed by the Mayor's and 3 by the Board
4	of Supervisors; and
5	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Yerba Buena Gardens Conservancy will employ its
6	own administrative staff and continue to contract for Gardens maintenance, operations,
7	security services as now; and
8	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Yerba Buena Gardens Conservancy will continue to
9	contract for coordinated events and activities programming as now; and
10	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, The Yerba Buena Gardens Conservancy will comply
11	with the Ralph M. Brown Act, the City Sunshine Ordinance, Ethics Commission regulations,
12	the City's contract bidding procedures, and comply with all the City's labor and human rights
13	policies; and
14	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, City Departments will continue to provide essential legal
15	and technical services to the Yerba Buena Gardens Conservancy as appropriately requested
16	by Yerba Buena Gardens Conservancy, including enforcing the former Redevelopment
17	Agency/OCII's funding agreements for the Gardens Maintenance, Operating, and Security
18	costs; and
19	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the annual funding revenues identified above that now
20	support the maintenance, operations, security, and programming of the Gardens parks, public
21	amenities, and cultural facilities shall continue to be fully dedicated to those purposes by the
22	City after it assumes ownership of the Gardens from OCII; and
23	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Museum of African Diaspora, the Mexican
24	Museum and the San Francisco Filipino Cultural Center are important cultural assets for the

1	City and County of San Francisco and should be included in the future planning scenarios for
2	the Yerba Buena Gardens Conservancy; and
3	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, The loss of annual operating support for the Gardens
4	from ground lease payments by the Moscone Convention Center shall be made up from civic
5	resources available for such purposes; and
6	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, The Gardens additional long-range capital improvement
7	funding needs set forth above shall be addressed as a project eligible to be funded by the
8	Community Facilities Funding District now proposed for the City's pending Central SOMA
9	Plan; and, be it
10	FURTHER RESOLVED, The San Francisco Real Estate Division shall draft such a
11	conceptual Community Facilities Funding Program for public review by March 31, 2017; and,
12	be it
13	FURTHER RESOLVED, The loss of annual operating support from the Moscone
14	Convention Center shall be made up from civic resources available for such purposes; and,
15	be it
16	FURTHER RESOLVED, The City Administrator shall identify the civic resources
17	potentially available to replace the annual operating support formerly provided by the
18	Moscone Convention Center by March 31, 2017.
