6	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Police Department previously implemented a
7	residency requirement until the mid-1980's; and
8	WHEREAS, This residency requirement was removed due to challenges in recruiting a
9	diverse workforce; and
10	WHEREAS, As of 2015, only 27% of the San Francisco Police Department's sworn
11	officers resided in San Francisco; and
12	WHEREAS, President Obama's 21st Century Policing Report included a
13	recommendation that law enforcement agencies institute incentive programs to allow public
14	safety officers to reside in the neighborhoods they serve; and
15	WHEREAS, The San Francisco public would require expedient service from the Police
16	Chief and police officers in the event of an emergency; and
17	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Police Commission conducted a national search for a
18	new Police Chief that indicated the preference for a San Francisco resident, but did not
19	include a residency requirement; and
20	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Police Commission and the Mayor will be finalizing the
21	search for the new Police Chief in the coming weeks; now, therefore, be it
22	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the San Francisco

Police Commission and the Mayor to require the new Police Chief to reside within the City and
