WHEREAS, Defending our beaches from unnecessary seawalls will protect, restore and enhance the natural character of the coast and ensure California's beaches remain open to the public, now and in the future; and

WHEREAS, California Assembly Member Mark Stone has introduced AB 1129, the Coastal Access and Protection Act of 2017, which will help prepare our coast for the impacts of climate change and preserve public access to the beach and other natural areas by clarifying the California Coastal Commission's authority to limit shoreline armoring; and

WHEREAS, AB 1129 will provide clear direction to the California Coastal Commission to minimize the use of armoring due to its adverse impacts on the coastal ecosystems and public access; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco Public Utilities Commission staff are working with Assembly Member Stone to ensure existing infrastructure at Ocean Beach will not be adversely impacted, consistent with past California Coastal Commission permit precedent; now, therefore, be it
