10	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
11	
12	Section 1. The Health Code is hereby amended by adding Article 1D, entitled "Animal
13	Fur Products," consisting of Sections 1D.1 through 1D.8, to read as follows:
14	ARTICLE 1D: ANIMAL FUR PRODUCTS
15	SEC. 1D.1. TITLE.
16	This Article 1D may be known as the "Animal Fur Products Ordinance."
17	SEC. 1D.2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.
18	(a) Historically, animals were hunted or trapped for food, and their pelts were used to
19	provide protective clothing. Over time, civilizations and technology have developed such that
20	fur is less of a necessity and more of a luxury. Fur garments are now typically designed for
21	fashion rather than warmth. Further, more animals are now killed to make decorative fur trim
22	than to manufacture full fur garments.
23	(b) More than 50 million animals are violently killed for their fur every year. Major
24	producers of fur include the United States, Canada, and Scandinavian countries.

- (c) More than 85% of pelts in the world's fur trade come from fur farms. The remaining 15% are from animals caught in the wild. Animals that are bred on fur farms commonly include mink, fox, marten, and chinchilla.
- (d) The majority of pelts produced annually are mink. In 2013, approximately 275 mink farms in 23 states across the United States produced about 3 million pelts, with an aggregate value of over \$300 million. As of 2015, mink pelt production in the United States totaled 3.76 million pelts. Mink pelt production in the United States saw a sharp increase between 2011 and 2014, but has since remained stable.

A vast majority—about 85%—of fur fashion products are made with pelts sourced from animal fur factory farms.

- (b) Animals raised on such fur farms typically spend their lives in cramped cages, and are subject to cruel and filthy living conditions. Methods frequently used on fur farms to kill livestock for their pelts include gassing, electrocution, poison, and neck breaking.
- (e) Fur farming can be damaging to the environment and contributes to water and air pollution. Fur processing often involves use of harmful chemicals including chromium and formaldehyde.
- (d)(f) Fur farming also consumes significant quantities of energy. The amount of energy required to produce a coat made of real fur from ranch-raised animal skins is over 15 times that needed to produce a fake fur garment. For each kilogram of factory-farmed mink fur, 110 kilograms of carbon dioxide is produced.
- (g) Existing laws require relatively little oversight of the fur farming and fur trade industries. Compliance with guidelines issued by the American Veterinary Medical Association is not mandatory, and fur farms are not monitored by any government agency.

(h) Federal law does forbid deceptive labeling of fur products, and requires that products made with real fur be labeled as such. This allows consumers to choose whether to purchase real or faux fur garments.

(e)(i) The sale of fur products in San Francisco is inconsistent with the City's ethos of treating all living beings, humans and animals alike, with kindness. In light of the wide array of faux fur and other alternatives for fashion and apparel, the demand for fur products does not justify the unnecessary killing and cruel treatment of animals. Eliminating the sale of fur products in San Francisco will promote community awareness of animal welfare, bolster the City's stance against animal cruelty, and, in turn, foster a more humane environment in San Francisco.

SEC. 1D.3. DEFINITIONS.

"Director" means the Director of the Department of Public Health or his or her designee.

"Fur" means any animal skin or part thereof with hair, fleece, or fur fibers attached thereto, either in its raw or processed state. "Fur" does not include such skins or parts thereof as are to be converted into leather, which in processing will have the hair, fleece, or fur fiber completely removed; cowhide with hair attached thereto; or lambskin or sheepskin with fleece attached thereto.

"Fur Product" means any article of clothing or covering for any part of the body, or any fashion accessory, including but not limited to handbags, shoes, slippers, hats, earmuffs, scarves, shawls, gloves, jewelry, and keychains, that is made in whole or in part of Fur. "Fur Product" does not include dog or cat fur products.

"Non-profit Organization" means any entity organized under 26 U.S.C. Section 501(c)(3) for charitable, religious, philanthropic, educational, or similar purposes.

"Used Fur Product" means a Fur Product that a person has acquired for his or her own use and worn.

SEC. 1D.4. PROHIBITING THE SALE OF FUR PRODUCTS.

- (a) Beginning July 1, 2018 January 1, 2019, it shall be unlawful to sell, offer for sale, display for sale, trade, give, donate, or otherwise distribute a Fur Product by any means in San Francisco.
- (b) Beginning January 1, 2019, it shall be unlawful to manufacture a Fur Product in San Francisco.
- (c) The prohibition in subsection (a) shall not apply to the sale, offer for sale, display for sale, trade, gift, donation, or other distribution of:
 - (1) Fur Products by a Non-profit Organization; or
- (2) Used Fur Products by a person not normally in the business of selling fur products,

 Non-profit Organization, or second-hand store, including a pawn shop; or
- (3)(2) Fur Products made from furbearing mammals and nongame mammals lawfully taken under the authority of a trapping license, pursuant to California Fish and Game Code Section 3039(b).
- (d) The prohibition in subsection (b) shall not apply to the manufacture of any Fur Product using Fur sourced exclusively from Used Fur Products.

SEC. 1D.5. IMPLEMENTATION AND ENFORCEMENT.

- (a) The Director may issue rules, regulations, and guidelines necessary or appropriate for the implementation and enforcement of this Article 1D.
- (b) Violations of this Article 1D or of any rule or regulation issued under this Article shall be punishable by administrative fines imposed pursuant to administrative citations. Administrative Code Chapter 100 "Procedures Governing the Imposition of Administrative Fines," as amended from time to time, is hereby incorporated and shall govern the issuance and enforcement of administrative citations, and collection and review of administrative fines, to enforce this Article and any rule or regulation adopted pursuant to this Article, with the following qualifications and exceptions for purposes of this Article:

- (1) The duties assigned to the Controller by Sections 100.1 100.15 of

 Administrative Code Chapter 100 shall be assumed and performed by the Director;
- (2) Each Fur Product that does not comply with Section 1D.4, on each day a violation is committed or permitted to continue, shall constitute a separate violation of this Article 1D;
- (3) A person who receives an administrative citation from the Director shall have 24 hours, or such greater time as deemed reasonable under the circumstances by the Director or an employee designated by the Director, to correct or otherwise remedy the violation prior to the imposition of administrative fines;
- (4) The fine for any violation issued pursuant to this Article shall be paid to the

 Treasurer of the City and County of San Francisco and credited to the Public Health Environmental

 Health Code Compliance Fund, authorized by Administrative Code Section 10.100-193;
- (5) The amount of the fine for violation of this Article 1D or of any rule or regulation issued under this Article shall be up to \$500 for a first violation; up to \$750 for a second violation within one year of the date of the first violation; and up to \$1,000 for each additional violation within one year of the date of a second or subsequent violation;
- (6) The Director may recover any costs and fees, including but not limited to attorneys' fees, for enforcement initiated through this Article 1D.

SEC. 1D.6. UNDERTAKING FOR THE GENERAL WELFARE.

In enacting and implementing this Article 1D, the City is assuming an undertaking only to promote the general welfare. It is not assuming, nor is it imposing on its officers and employees, an obligation for breach of which it is liable in money damages to any person who claims that such breach proximately caused injury.

SEC. 1D.7. NO CONFLICT WITH FEDERAL OR STATE LAW.

This Article 1D is intended to be a lawful exercise of the City's police power, and shall be construed so as not to conflict with State or federal law. Nothing in this Article shall authorize any

City agency or department to impose any duties or obligations in conflict with limitations on the City's authority established by State or federal law at the time such agency or departmental action is taken.

The City shall suspend enforcement of this Article if and only to the extent that enforcement would conflict with a preemptive State or federal law.

SEC. 1D.8. SEVERABILITY.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Article 1D, or any application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions or applications of the Article. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each and every section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, and word not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to whether any other portion of this Article or application thereof would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 2. Effective and Operative Dates. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance. However, as stated in Health Code Section 1D.4, the prohibitions in Section 1D.4(a) and (b) shall not become operative until July 1, 2018 January 1, 2019.

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REVISED LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

(January 24, 2018 - Amended in Committee)

[Health Code - Banning Sale and Manufacture of Animal Fur Products]

Ordinance amending the Health Code to ban the sale and manufacture in San Francisco of animal fur products.

Existing Law

San Francisco law does not presently address the sale or manufacture of products made with animal fur. California Penal Code Section 598a makes it a misdemeanor to possess, import into the State, sell, buy, give away or accept any pelt of a dog or cat with the sole intent of selling or giving away the pelt. California Fish and Game Code Section 3039 provides that goods made from furbearing mammals and nongame mammals trapped lawfully under the authority of a trapping license may be bought or sold at any time.

19 U.S. Code Section 1308 makes it unlawful to import or export any dog or cat fur product, or to engage in interstate commerce, sell, offer to sell, trade, advertise, transport, or distribute in interstate commerce, any dog or cat fur product, punishable via civil penalty of up to \$10,000 per violation.

Amendments to Current Law

This proposal would ban the sale, display for sale, and manufacture of "fur products" in San Francisco. For the purposes of this ordinance, "fur" would include any animal skin or part thereof with hair, fleece or fur fibers attached thereto, either in its raw or processed state, and exclude such skins as are to be converted into leather, which in processing shall have the hair, fleece or fur fiber completely removed, cowhide with hair attached thereto, or lambskin or sheepskin with fleece attached thereto. "Fur products" would include articles of clothing or covering for the body, or any fashion accessory, including handbags, shoes, slippers, hats, earmuffs, scarves, shawls, gloves, jewelry, keychains, and like items, that is made in whole or in part of fur, excluding dog and cat fur products. "Used fur products" would include any fur product a person has acquired for his or her own use and has worn.

The sales ban would not apply to certain sales of used fur products, or the sale of fur products made from furbearing mammals and nongame mammals lawfully taken under the authority of a trapping license, pursuant to California Fish and Game Code Section 3039, subdivision (b). The manufacturing ban would not apply to the manufacture of fur products from fur sourced exclusively from used fur products.

The ordinance would charge the Director of the Department of Public Health and/or his or her designee(s) with oversight and enforcement. It would be become operative on January 1, 2019.


Background

Details of the Proposed Legislation

- As of January 1, 2019, the proposed legislation would ban the sale, offer for sale, display for sale, manufacturing, donation, giving, or other distribution of fur products in San Francisco.
- The possession of fur products is not banned; nor are out-of-town or online sales explicitly prohibited.
- Fur is defined as animal skin with hair, fleece, or fur fibers attached, unless the animal was taken under a State trapping license. Other animal skin products including leather, lambskin, wool, etc. are not affected.
- Fur products are clothing or fashion accessories; the sale and manufacture of fur products for dogs and cats would not be prohibited.
- The sale of used fur products would be allowed, provided it was by a second-hand store, pawn-shop, non-profit organization, or any other business not normally in the business of selling fur products.

Impact Estimates

How Much Fur Is Sold in San Francisco?

- The only official source for economic statistics on product sales is the Economic Census, which is conducted every 5 years. The most recent published edition dates from 2012.
- This data relies on the NAPCS (North American Product Classification System), which contains only one relevant category, "Furs and Fur Garments".
- According to the Census, retail sales of that product category in California totaled \$355 million in 2012.
- While the product-level data is not available for cities and counties, if fur product sales in San Francisco reflect the city's share of all retail sales in California, that would lead to \$10.8 million in sales in San Francisco in 2012.

The San Francisco Chamber's Sales Estimate

- On March 9th, the San Francisco Chamber of Commerce shared with the Controller's Office the results of a survey it conducted on retailers that sell fur products in the city.
- 9 retailers responded indicating they sold fur products affected by the proposed ban.
- Two large stores reported annual sales "in excess of \$4 million". Two medium-sized retailers reported sales between \$75,000 and \$500,000, while six small retailers reported sales of between \$75,000 and \$900,000 million.
- The Chamber notes that, in some stores, "[fur product] sales comprise 75% of gross annual sales."
- The Chamber believes that 50 retailers in San Francisco sell fur products that would be prohibited under the proposed legislation, and total sales are approximately \$40 million per year.

Impact Estimates

What Could Explain the Difference?

- The Chamber's estimate is roughly four times the number we obtained from the Census data.
- As a regional retail center and a tourism center, Union Square likely accounts for a disproportionate share of luxury retail sales, including fur products, and that may account for some of the difference.
- Sales have likely grown since 2012. Overall, San Francisco taxable retail sales have increased by 52% from 2012 to 2017.
- There may be a slight difference in the range of products covered by the ban, from those covered in the Census definition of fur products.
- There may be difficulties in extrapolating from the Chamber's survey results to the full universe of fur product retailers in San Francisco.

Implications

- Even if fur product sales were significantly higher than our Census-based estimate, the proposed legislation is unlikely to significantly harm the overall local economy, using our standard guidelines for determining economic impact.
- Nevertheless, a set of local retailers would be harmed by the legislation.
 Small retailers specialized in fur sales would find adjustment to the ban more challenging than department stores.
- Additionally, the legislation could weaken the overall economy by contributing to a further leakage of retail sales, and sales tax, as online and out-of-town purchases are not explicitly subject to the legislation.
- A phasing-in of the legislation such as prohibiting the wholesale delivery of fur products before prohibiting retail sales—may allow retailers to clear their inventory.
- In addition, a broadening of the allowance on selling used fur products could allow small specialty retailers to better adjust to the ban.

I am Skip Pas from West Coast Leather. I am speaking out against the full fur ban. We have been a retailer in San Francisco since 1969. Though most of our merchandise consists of leather, we also carry merchandise that has fur trim. To lose the ability to carry a full and varied inventory will affect our overall sales, as well as affect our staff and their commissions.

The long-standing retail stores in the City of San Francisco deserve a more thorough, unbiased investigation. The City Attorney should re-review the data after such investigation and block this measure because of the severe economic impact to many retail stores, which is estimated to be 40 to 70 million dollars. Not 1 million. Retail is struggling with the Amazon economy as it is. The great city of San Francisco is in the top 10 shopping destinations in the world and needs to maintain this status. This legislation will end up costing the city millions of dollars in lost revenue and will certainly increase the number of stores that will have to close. Keep small business strong. Keep our shopping rights options open.

The Board of Supervisors has lacked the oversight to let this go to committee in the first place with no data supplied either to the public or myself after 3 requests in person, by phone and email to Katy Tang and her office. The Supervisors have a due diligence responsibility to our citizens, which has not been carried out with impunity. Negotiations need to be held with the retailers of the city on such a delicate issue. Not pushed through by the Board of Supervisors without a public vote. At a minimum this issue should be put on a ballot so the citizens of San Francisco can decide.

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Re: Global certification proposal catalyzed by San Francisco proposed fur ban

Dear Supervisors of the Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee,

I am writing on behalf of the international fur industry and thank you in advance for taking the time to listen and consider the issues that we raise in this letter before you vote on the proposed fur ban ordinance. We appreciate the direct and forceful challenge that has been issued to the industry to examine practices and procedures, and to identify positive, meaningful steps we could take to find areas of common ground and possible compromise with San Franciscans concerned about the continued ethical treatment of animals.

Over the last few years, our industry has explored proposals for a certification program that would manifest consumer transparency, ecological sustainability and the continued humane treatment of animals as its abiding principles. As the industry leaders largely driving this effort, our guiding aspiration has been to develop a process by which fur products eligible for certification would remain identifiable and traceable throughout the supply chain. For consumers considering the purchase of a fur product, the certification standard would offer recognizable and verifiable assurance that the product has met the highest standards in environmental responsibility and the continued humane treatment of animals.

The fur industry's practices are far superior and more responsible than what our critics contend. Yet at the same time, we also believe our industry is perhaps uniquely situated among the multitude of other enterprises engaged in animal products to develop and implement new, continually evolving, independently verifiable standards of excellence and ethical treatment that would be unprecedented in global commerce. That ambition has been the driving force in our efforts to adopt a stringent new certification standard of our industry.

The fur industry is international, operating under a variety of certification programs and licensure policies that are national, statewide and provincial, and that are, in many cases, also subject to the tribal sovereignty of indigenous and First Nation communities. Although these diverse sources of legal and regulatory guidance have helped to inform our approach to industrywide standards, they have also lent complexity to it. Moreover, our efforts to lead these groundbreaking changes have been slowed by the challenges one would expect to see in any global industry. Despite broad scale support among the leading industry organizations to adopt a more robust and transparent system, implementation has proven to be challenging.

San Francisco's proposed fur ban legislation has created the urgency that has allowed us to fast-track our efforts and we are excited to make history with San Francisco as the first city in the world to introduce a certification program that provides comprehensive consumer education and transparency.

As you are probably aware, San Francisco is itself a globally acknowledged brand name in luxury retail, and its reputation as a trend-setter extends to fashion no less than culture or politics. Travelers familiar with the handful of cities commonly selected by top fashion designers for retail locations will instantly recognize the city's inclusion on an exclusive list of similarly regarded locales like Paris, Milan, London, New York, Tokyo and very few others. Even before the Union Square Business Improvement District and the San Francisco Chamber of Commerce reached out to us on behalf of the businesses and commercial real estate brokers it represents, we heard from several leading figures from the realms of fashion design and retail who were similarly motivated by news about Supervisor Katy Tang's proposed ban on the sale of certain fur products in San Francisco. The challenge you issued to us was expressed no less forcefully by many others we regard as similarly persuasive, and our industry has heard you -- loud and clear.

The proposal outlined below is one that we believe finds the common ground you and others asked us to identify. It is a groundbreaking step in consumer transparency and third-party accountability exceeding any other consumer product category we're aware of. We believe its seriousness and global scope offer a basis for meaningful progress on underlying values we strongly share in truth with most supporters of the proposed legislation. If successful in forging a workable compromise with San Francisco, we believe this program will elevate public understanding for state-of-the-art practices that are humane and environmentally responsible, while maximizing industry adherence worldwide for the highest standards our new industry certification standard would represent. As a first-of-its-kind program, we are also cognizant that its success may also serve as a model for other industries involved in the manufacture or sale of animal products for consumers, including food, leather and many others.

Proposal: FurMark Certification Standard

The certification standard we propose as a result of San Francisco's leadership in moving issues of animal welfare to the forefront and forging industry consensus would be far more than a marketing gimmick or subjective but otherwise uninformative "seal of approval."

Under the FurMark Certification Standard...

- Labels would appear on standards-compliant garments that include fur that certification standards were rigorously observed at every step in the product development and supply chain phases.
- Links would be available to provide consumers and the general public with full details about the criteria employed for adjudging practices as standards-compliant at all stages of production and design in fur garments.
- All fur farming standards are being developed and will be regularly updated by third-party peer reviewers, drawing on independent expertise in state furbearer resource research, animal ethics, animal husbandry and experts from universities, animal welfare non-profit groups, government oversight agencies.
- As a policy alternative to a ban, San Francisco could be the first city in the world to either require by ordinance or endorse by resolution that certification and traceability labels be provided on all fur garments sold in the City as soon as practicable following implementation of the program.
- The FurMark Certification would be globally implemented, in multiple languages. Unique
 to San Francisco could be an additional requirement for educational and instructional
 programs on animal welfare for retailers and sales professionals, as well as for consumers.
- Traceability and certification components would mandate the creation of industry funded continuity of independent oversight bodies to ensure all furs eligible for certification are ethically sourced and fully adherent to the strictest and most current animal welfare standards.
- Standards themselves would be subject to continual review and improvement with the input and oversight of third party experts. This would encourage ongoing innovations in equipment and best practices, and for the continued humane treatment and sound environmental stewardship as an industry imperative.
- For fur faming, the program would require and make verifiable to consumers certification that...

- o Fur farming standards have independent third-party oversight, are peer-reviewed and posted online with full details for scrutiny by consumers and policymakers.
- o Fur farms would be independently inspected, audited and re-approved for certification every 15 to 18 months, depending on the jurisdiction.
- o After the inspections, there will be random audits of the inspections to further enhance standards and adherence, ensuring the integrity of the program.
- Aggregated and anonymized results of fur farm certifications would be publicly accessible online and also provided to city policymakers and designated city animal care officials.
- For wild-caught furs, FurMark Certification would require and strengthen global industry compliance:
 - o Improving education about and enforcement of the two standards developed by the International Organization for Standardization, or ISO.
- FurMark Certification would require rigorous enforcement and transparency for animal welfare standards memorialized by the first International Understanding between the United States of America and the European Union. Canada and Russia have a similar agreement. These standards are used by professional furbearer biologist in management of numerous species in those respective countries. The FurMark certification would further extend approved management programs to ensure that wildfur exports and imports among member countries are responsibly sourced and sustainably managed.
- FurMark Certification would ensure that current education and enforcement programs aimed at meeting the ISO standard would be continued.
- Educational programs could be an additional component of the San Francisco portion of the FurMark Certification standard, and we would invite input from local policymakers on possibilities to benefit the imperatives of environmental responsibility and animal welfare locally, while strengthening adherence to ethical best practices worldwide.
- Priorities for industry instructional programs would address: sustainable use of wildlife populations; humane treatment of animals; and the importance of ethical, responsible and sustainable use of animals to minimize and eliminate needless waste.
- Regular and ongoing development of improved methods for wild fur trapping and capture
 devices will continually strengthen animal welfare standards, offering benefits for the
 welfare of all fur bearing species including those subject to non-commercial trapping by
 governmental wildlife management agencies and educational institutions.

• In fact, the commercial fur industry's commitment to such improvements would offer enormous ancillary benefits for trapping for non-commercial and governmental purposes (of which the commercial fur trade represents a relatively small portion). Trapping and capture programs employed by wildlife agencies internationally are critical for protecting endangered and threatened species from over-abundant predator populations. In many areas of the world, for example, unmanaged populations of foxes and coyotes pose enormous risks to endangered species, including whooping cranes and other at-risk bird species that nest on the ground. Trapping plays an essential role for such agencies to protect endangered species threatened by over-abundant predation.

The industry would additionally consider guidance from San Francisco policymakers, retailers and consumers to potentially develop and implement a levy program on all fur products sold locally to benefit local animal shelters, local welfare related charities or to endow local scholarships in animal care education. Across the U.S., many independent retailers and producers currently have similar programs in place successfully raising much-needed support to prolong and improve the lives of animals.

As mentioned previously, the proposal outlined above represents a groundbreaking innovation in product transparency, third-party accountability and consumer information that far exceeds that of most other consumer products, including those that also depend on the use of animals for food, garments and other kinds of products. Although much of the detail involved in the FurMark Certification Standard is necessarily specific to the fur industry, it's abiding principles and framework are readily adaptable as a model for other businesses engaged in commercial uses of animal products. A successful and workable compromise with San Francisco would strengthen adherence to animal welfare and environmental priorities worldwide and offer an example to other industries whose consumers would also benefit from similar approaches to stronger enforcement, accountability and transparency of information about the products they may consider for purchase.

Beyond innovations to strengthen and improve global adherence to best possible industry practices, the industry is also committed to improved public education now on current industry practices designed to ensure the humane treatment of animals. Whether for consideration by the San Francisco Board of Supervisors or made available more to communities they recommend to us, we would gladly provide additional information and educational programs on the following:

- How traps and capture devices are tested and continually improved for commercial and non-commercial use;
- International treaties by which the United States abides for all domestic trapping;
- Fur farming certification standards, enforcement practices and research, including noncommercial laboratory research; and

• The fur industry's strong emphasis on the sustainable and full use of animal by-products for the multitude of benefits they offer, which range from commercial fishing to biodiesel, fertilizer, and the perfume industry and cosmetics industries.

There is no higher priority for us as industry leaders than strict adherence to the highest possible standards and practices in animal welfare and environmental responsibility. The FurMark Certification Standard we propose reflects an approach that showcases our commitment to those values in unprecedented ways. As the leading organizations in our industry, we strive continually to explore new advances and improve standards based on science, with full participation from independent researchers and animal welfare advocates. To be sure, we also recognize that we must do more in order to ensure that consumers, policymakers, designers, retailers and others are fully apprised of our existing practices as well as the bold new initiative we proposed. And we invite recommendations from San Francisco policymakers on specific steps we could take locally to improve public understanding of the scope of our commitment to animal welfare and the environment.

San Francisco, as a fashion leader and international retail destination for tourists, is a pioneer on many issues, including animal welfare. Although we obviously disagree with the proposed fur sales ban legislation as the industry it targets, we fully recognize — and indeed fully share — many of the concerns that form the proposed ban's rationale. We believe the robust enforcement and certification program we propose— backed by a recognizable certification standard that empowers consumers like never before to make informed and ethical choices in the animal products they consider for purchase— fully reflects those concerns. We believe our proposal will do far more to accomplish the worthy aims of humane treatment of animals and sound ecological practices than the alternative proposal under consideration. San Francisco deserves credit for catalyzing our industry's overdue progress in developing the standards and programs discussed in this letter. We offer this first-of-its-kind, model approach as a policy alternative worthy of San Francisco and its values. We believe it promises real, meaningful and verifiable progress on issues of animal welfare and environmental protection worldwide, with innovations in consumer transparency and accountability that will have lasting and widespread benefits.

Rather than merely adopting a ban that is neither based on fact nor real considerations of sustainability or environmental concerns and that would result in the loss of millions of dollars in tax revenues and jobs as well as the likely increase in retail vacancies in the city's core, we urge you to consider this proposal. The proposed ban, which still allows for the sale of a wide range of fur types will have little impact. Those that seek the limited items that cannot be purchased in SF will access them through stores just outside SF or via e-commerce. It also sets a very dangerous precedent in opening the door for further actions against leather and wool, already the focus of active animal rights campaigns.

The consumer has spoken and the prominence of fur on the runways for the fall 2018 collections just completed in NY, London, Paris and Milan reflects the popularity of fur fashion and the strong consumer demand. In the absence of real, natural fur retailers will likely move to "faux" fur to

meet this demand. Natural fur is sustainable, renewable and environmentally friendly and strict animal welfare standards are in place in the U.S and North America to ensure the humane treatment of animals. But the "faux" fur product available today is the complete antithesis of the ideals of sustainability and the concept of responsible environmental conservation that reflect the core values of San Francisco. By inadvertently promoting faux fur, a petroleum-based product that is not renewable, sustainable or biodegradable, and releases thousands of tiny plastic lint fibers into waste water when washed that are then released into oceans and rivers where they are ingested by fish, mammals and sea birds, this proposed ban directly contradicts the many positive environmental moves the SF city council has taken regarding plastics and Styrofoam.

The vast majority of consumers — in San Francisco and around the world — make consumer choices every day that involve the use of animal products. Among the multitude of such products, those produced by the fur industry are targeted perhaps because they are the most expensive and least well understood. Recognizing our responsibility to do more as an industry to improve transparency and enhance standards, we offer a groundbreaking proposal that will empower informed consumer choices, that will improve standards and practices worldwide, and that embodies values we believe we share with the large majority of San Franciscans.

On behalf of all of industry organizations listed below, we welcome the opportunity to discuss the program and related efforts with you in greater detail. We also invite opportunities to meet with or answer questions from city policymakers to elaborate.

I would like to thank Supervisor Katy Tang for proposing the ordinance banning the sale of animal fur in San Francisco. My name is Chin Chi and I'm a Chinese-American grandmother who has lived in this city for over 30 years and I wholeheartedly support this ban!

Every year, fifty-million animals are slaughtered for their fur. About 85% of fur fashion products are made with pelts sourced from animal fur factory farms, and, like other animals in such farms, they live a tormented life from birth to death. The 15% wildlife caught for their fur die agonizing deaths in steel leg-hold traps.

And, like other factory farms, fur farming also pollutes our land, water and air. In recent years, the pollution has become worse because these fur pelts are no longer used just as is, but are often further processed to make them into knitted products and dark colored furs are dyed the color of cream or pink.

In the West, the popularity of wearing animal fur seems to have decreased and the increase in the quality and quantity of fake fur has made it completely unnecessary as a way to keep warm. Fake furs are much more comfortable and practical and can be made into any kind of texture or color and, very important, such production is much less harmful to the environment. But, as pointed out by an article in National Geographic about a year ago: in the eastern European countries, especially in Russia and China, animal fur garments have become very fashionable, especially for their newly rich members.

For the material benefit and vanity of a few of the rich, the fur industry flourishes by inflicting terriple pain on millions of our fellow living beings and in a way that aids the further destruction of our environment. Although it has never sold a lot of fur, San Francisco today is one of biggest tourist attractions in the world, and moral positions this city takes, the City of Saint Francis, the Patron Saint of Animals, will resonate loud and clear throughout the world. So I hope we will all come together and declare: NO ANIMAL FUR IN SAN FRANCISCO! IT IS NOT FASHIONABLE, IT IS AN ATROCITY!







San Francisco is getting ready to make a very important decision this week: whether to ban the sale of cruel fur products. Animals brutally maimed in savage traps and suffering in torturous fur farms need your urgent support right now!

The fur industry confines and kills over 50 million animals every year, including dogs and cats. Many of the animals, like foxes, rabbits, and minks are kept in small cages for their entire lives, severely limiting their natural activities. They often go insane from stress and boredom.

The brutal end to their lives often comes as they are gassed to death or anally and vaginally electrocuted in order to prevent damage to their skins. Other animals, like coyotes, are trapped in the wild where they are separated from their children and endure days of suffering before they are bludgeoned or shot to death.

Not only is fur cruel and unnecessary, it is processed into garments using caustic and often toxic chemicals such as formaldehyde and chromium 33, which are listed as carcinogenic and hazardous to human health.

Given the inherent cruelty of fur, progressive cities such as West Hollywood and Berkeley have passed bans on fur products. Gucci, Michael Kors, and other designers have recently prohibited the use of fur in their fashion lines. And, just a few days ago, the nation of Norway committed to ending its fur production, becoming the latest of a dozen countries to pass similar restrictions.

Please do the right thing and pass this vital legislation. The animals are counting on us to condemn cruel fur to the history books.

Thank you very much for your email, and thanks for the intro to Ashley Summers. I am aware of the proposed ordinance and did send Supervisor Tang an email a few weeks ago.

While I do agree with Sec.1D.2. Findings and Purpose I would like to point out that it does not at all apply to furs from animals raised humanely for their meat, such as sheep, goats, rabbits, etc. In fact the complete use of the entire animal is more environmentally and ecologically sound than not. We make every effort to use everything from the animals we raise: from the manure for our vineyards to the pelts which are tanned for sale whole, and are made into added value products by my wife which we sell at the Farmers Market; scarves, hats, gloves, muffs, leg warmers, pillows, etc. This gives us another avenue of financial diversification to help our small, local family farm survive. Please do not confuse the use of furs from humanely raised meat animals with those from animals that are raised on factory fur farms.

Unfortunately, I will not be able to attend the hearing on Wednesday, but would hope that perhaps this email could be read.

Dear Supervisors of the Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee:

I write on behalf of the Animal Legal Defense Fund (ALDF) and our roughly 25,000 members and supporters in California, approximately 1,000 of whom live in San Francisco County, in support of Supervisor Tang's proposed ordinance to ban the sale of animal fur products. ALDF has been working for nearly four decades to protect the lives and advance the interests of animals through the legal system, including supporting similar bans in West Hollywood and Berkeley. We hope that San Francisco continues its role as a leader of progressive legislative initiatives by becoming the third jurisdiction in the United States to stand up to the cruel fur industry.

As a practical matter, there is simply no such thing as "humanely-raised" fur as all fur products are derived from inherently cruel and wasteful production methods. Fur products are either from animals raised on fur farms – places in which fur-bearing mammals bred solely for their fur, live in crammed, unsanitary quarters, and die painful deaths (unregulated by any laws) that put preservation of pelts above animal suffering. As such, slaughter methods such as poisoning, electrocution, and gassing, are common practice in the fur industry. "Wild caught" fur is also the product of extreme suffering as this fur is derived from animals caught in steel traps who die slow and painful deaths. Steel traps are so barbaric, that the European Union, as well as many states (including California) ban the use of such traps on public lands.

San Francisco has the legal authority to protect the welfare of animals within the county limits and enacting this ordinance would certainly advance the interests of animals. Regulation and certification cannot address the inherent cruelty of the fur industry, therefore, it is imperative that progressive jurisdictions outlaw items that are the product of clear violations of animal welfare. Moreover, such legislation is in line with promoting the progressive values that have been synonymous with San Francisco for many years. I urge you to vote yes on this ordinance.
