WHEREAS, Hepatitis B is one of the top five causes of mortality in San Francisco; and, WHEREAS, Hepatitis B is completely preventable through vaccination; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Department of Public Health has identified primary goals to deal with the problem of Hepatitis B infection; and,

WHEREAS, One goal is to raise awareness among adults of the importance of being tested for Hepatitis, being vaccinated if unprotected and being monitored if infected with the disease; and,

WHEREAS, Another goal is to raise awareness among health care providers of the need to test and/or monitor Hepatitis B status; and,

WHEREAS, Another goal is to improve the percentage rate of adults who have been screened for Hepatitis B and have been vaccinated; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Department of Public Health and the Stanford Asian Liver Center have joined resources to offer low cost hepatitis B testing and vaccination; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Department of Public Health will host a forum on Protecting San Francisco's Asian Population from Hepatitis B on Thursday, May 12, 2005; now, therefore be it,

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors declares May 2005 to be "Hepatitis Awareness Month" in the City and County of San Francisco.
