


County Adult Assistance Programs (CAAP)

- About 5,500 low-income single adults receive CAAP cash assistance and supports every month
- Almost all recipients must engage in monthly activities in order to remain eligible for support: .e.g. Workfare, Job Training, GED, or applying for federal disability (SSI)
- As of Jan 2025, Proposition F requires those receiving CAAP assistance to engage in treatment if they are found to have a substance use disorder (illegal substances only)
- SFHSA is partnering with experts at the San Francisco Department of Public Health and other community stakeholders to identify the range of treatment options and treatment guidelines for this pathway
- Cash Not Drugs, or contingency management, would be among those treatment options available (per funding availability)




Treatment Pathway Initiative (Proposition F)



Cash Not Drugs Implementation Planning

- SFHSA will partner with DPH to develop an Implementation Plan
- Implementation Plan will include:
 - Review of existing CM programs in SF
 - Program design recommendations: eligibility, duration, scale, payment structure, supportive services, etc.
 - Cost estimates
 - Contracting mechanism
 - Evaluation approach
- Implementation Plan is due 6 months after passage
