

Jurisdiction in the Right of Way

Public Works:

Streets, sidewalks, medians, street trees, curb ramps

 Private utility work is coordinated and regulated by Public Works
 PG&E, AT&T, Comcast etc

• SFMTA:

Traffic engineering, traffic signals, Muni tracks and right of way

SFPUC:

Most streetlights, water and sewer systems




