 17 Section 3. As of ~~March 17, 2011~~ the effective date of this ordinance, the Botanical Garden
 18 entrance fee shall expire due to Sec. 12.46(d) of the Park Code which states that “the non-
 19 resident fee for the Botanical Gardens shall sunset at the end of Fiscal Year 2010-11.
 20 Further, if the Department receives revenue from a new tax that could cover operating and
 21 maintenance of the Botanical Gardens, the entrance fee shall expire within 90 days after the
 22 effective date of the new tax.”
