[Funding Reallocation - Our City, Our Home Homelessness Gross Receipts Tax - Services to Address Homelessness - \$34,777,000~~88,495,000~~ Plus Up to \$19,100,000 of Future Revenue - Through FY 2026-2027-28]

Ordinance authorizing the City to reallocate approximately \$34,777,000~~88,495,000~~ in prior appropriated revenue and unappropriated earned interest within the Our City, Our Home (“OCOH”) Fund, to allow the City to use revenues from the Homelessness Gross Receipts Tax through Fiscal Year (FY) 2026-2027-28 for certain types of services to address homelessness, notwithstanding the expenditure percentages set forth in Business and Tax Regulations Code, Section 2810; where future revenue and interest to the OCOH Fund exceeds amounts appropriated in the adopted budget for fiscal years 2025-2026 and 2026-2027, authorizing the City to expend up to \$19,100,000 of future such additional revenues and interest deposited in the OCOH Fund, through Fiscal Year 2027-28 on any programs to address homelessness as described in Business and Tax Regulations Code, Section 2810, without regard to the expenditure percentages in that section; temporarily suspending the limit on funding for short-term rental subsidies; and finding that these reallocations are necessary to achieve the purposes of the Our City, Our Home Fund pursuant to Business and Tax Regulations Code, Section 2811.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

2 Section 1. Background and Findings.

3 (a) In November 2018, the voters approved Proposition C and imposed a
4 Homelessness Gross Receipts Tax to fund programs to prevent and address homelessness.
5 As stated in the measure, “San Francisco is experiencing a housing crisis of historic
6 proportions that has led to a major humanitarian and public health crisis in large-scale
7 homelessness for which the City has insufficient resources to address.”

8 (b) Recognizing the scope of the crisis, the voters identified a range of purposes for
9 the tax, the proceeds of which the City deposits in the Our City, Our Home (“OCOH”) Fund.
10 Among other things, the tax is intended to help the City house the homeless; expand the
11 number of shelter beds; eliminate waiting periods for shelter; decrease the visible presence of
12 homeless people and tent encampments on City streets; move unhoused people into stable
13 housing; fund legal assistance, rent subsidies, mental health services, and substance abuse
14 services to keep people housed; reduce overall costs for the City; and fund certain specified
15 programs. The purposes of November 2018 Proposition C are codified at Business and Tax
16 Regulations Code Section 2802.

17 (c) To achieve these purposes, Business and Tax Regulations Code Section 2810
18 identifies four eligible programs that the City may spend OCOH funds on – Permanent
19 Housing, Homeless Shelters, Homelessness Prevention, and Mental Health Treatment for
20 Homeless Individuals – and identifies a maximum or minimum percentage of the total OCOH
21 Fund balance that each eligible program receives. Section 2810 further states that OCOH
22 funds shall be appropriated subject to the budgetary and fiscal provisions of the Charter, and
23 that any amounts remaining in the OCOH Fund at the end of a fiscal year shall be held in the
24 OCOH Fund to be added to amounts available for appropriation on eligible programs in any
25 future year. In Section 2811, the voters also authorized the Board of Supervisors to amend

1 the measure, by ordinance, by a two-thirds vote and only to further the findings and intent
2 summarized above in subsection (b). Accordingly, in 2023 and 2024, the Board adopted
3 Ordinance Nos. 185-23 and 202-24, which together reallocated more than \$30,000,000 in
4 interest income from the Fund so that the City could more effectively address homelessness
5 in fiscal years 2023-2024 and 2024-2025, despite the specific expenditure percentages that
6 otherwise would have applied in those fiscal years.

7 (d) The City continues to fund all implemented programs recommended by the
8 OCOH Oversight Committee, which makes recommendations for the use of the Fund. And
9 yet, there is a significant unencumbered balance in the Fund (approximately \$59,517,000)
10 and estimated interest earnings on ~~these~~ Fund balances (approximately \$28,978,000), in
11 large part because the City has obtained approximately \$100 million in state grants for
12 permanent housing, including projects dedicated to families and transitional age youth. The
13 original percentage allocations in Section 2810 are based estimates of annual revenue and
14 did not anticipate these additional revenues and accrued interest earnings. As this Fund
15 balance sits unspent, the Fund will also continue to receive additional revenue in the coming
16 fiscal years, but thousands of people are still on the streets without adequate shelter, interim
17 housing, and mental health treatment. In the immediate term, there is a particular need to
18 direct more funding to shelter and hygiene programs. The Board of Supervisors finds that to
19 achieve the purposes of the November 2018 Proposition C, the City must meet the crisis
20 where it is currently most acute, and hereby approves a reallocation of a portion of the
21 existing unencumbered revenues and interest earnings over the next two ~~three~~ fiscal years to
22 shelter and hygiene programs, and also approves a reallocation of a portion of the earned
23 interest and the additional revenues if such revenue and interest exceed the amounts
24 appropriated in the adopted budgets in fiscal years 2025-26 and 2026-27 ~~that the Fund will~~
25

1 ~~earn during these fiscal years~~, so that the City can spend these revenues on eligible
2 expenditures defined in Section 2810 to prevent and address homelessness.

4 Section 2. Under the authority in Business and Tax Regulations Code Section 2811,
5 for fiscal year 2025-2026:

6 (a) Expenditures on short-term rental subsidies may exceed the percentage
7 specified in Business and Tax Regulations Code subsection 2810(b)(3)(A)(i); and,

8 (b) Up to ~~\$14,576,000~~14,487,000 of interest earned in the Fund, comprised of
9 \$8,358,000 of interest earned and \$6,218,000 of unprogrammed Fund balance, which
10 otherwise would have accrued to general permanent housing (~~\$9,238,000~~6,129,000); and
11 permanent housing for homeless youth aged 18 through 29 (~~\$5,338,000~~2,229,000),
12 ~~permanent housing for homeless families with children (\$2,786,000), and homelessness~~
13 ~~prevention (\$3,343,000)~~, shall instead be allocated to shelters and hygiene programs
14 (subsection 2810(b)(3)(B)), for programming such as:

15 (1) Hotel vouchers for families experiencing homelessness;

16 (2) Expanded shelter capacity, including clinical staffing for existing shelter
17 sites; and

18 (3) Hotel vouchers for victims of domestic violence.

20 Section 3. Under the authority in Business and Tax Regulations Code Section 2811, for
21 fiscal year 2026-2027:

22 (a) Expenditures on short-term rental subsidies may exceed the percentage
23 specified in Business and Tax Regulations Code subsection 2810(b)(3)(A)(i); and,

24 (b) Up to ~~\$20,201,000~~36,516,000 in the Fund, comprised of approximately
25 ~~\$9,054,000~~22,025,000 of ~~unencumbered~~ unprogrammed Fund balance and

1 ~~\$11,147,000~~14,491,000 of earned interest, which otherwise would have accrued to general
2 permanent housing (~~\$9,148,000~~12,423,000), permanent housing for homeless youth aged 18
3 through 29 (~~\$5,248,000~~8,523,000), and permanent housing for homeless families with
4 children (~~\$5,805,000~~9,080,000), ~~and homelessness prevention (\$6,490,000)~~, shall instead be
5 allocated to shelters and hygiene programs (subsection 2810(b)(3)(B)), for programming such

12 Section 4. Under the authority in Business and Tax Regulations Code Section 2811, for
13 fiscal year 2027-2028:

22 Section 45. Under the authority in Business and Tax Regulations Code Section 2811,
23 if future revenues and future earned interest deposited in the OCOH Fund exceed the
24 amounts appropriated in the adopted budget for fiscal years 2025-2026 and 2026-2027, the
25 Board of Supervisors authorizes the City to expend up to \$19,100,000 of such additional

1 revenues or interest ~~future revenues that will be deposited in the OCOH Fund through fiscal~~
2 ~~year 2027-28, after addressing the specified costs required under subsections 2810(b)(1) and~~
3 ~~(2),~~ among any or all of the eligible programs to address or prevent homelessness as
4 described in subsections 2810(b)(3)(A)-(D), notwithstanding the specific percentage
5 allocations that would otherwise apply, subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors by
6 appropriation.

8 Section 56. Prerequisites for Enactment; Super-Majority Vote Requirement. The
9 enactment of Sections 2, 3, and 4, ~~and 5~~ of this ordinance are subject to Section 2811 of the
10 Business and Tax Regulations Code, which requires the amendments to be approved by a
11 supermajority vote of at least eight members of the Board of Supervisors.
12

13 Section 67. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
14 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
15 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
16 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
17

18 Section 78. Undertaking for the General Welfare. In enacting and implementing this
19 ordinance, the City is assuming an undertaking only to promote the general welfare. It is not
20 assuming, nor is it imposing on its officers and employees, an obligation for breach of which it
21 is liable in money damages to any person who claims that such breach proximately caused
22 injury.
23

24 Section 89. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word
25 of this ordinance, or any application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held to be

1 invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision
2 shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions or applications of the ordinance. The
3 Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each and
4 every section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, and word not declared invalid or
5 unconstitutional without regard to whether any other portion of this ordinance or application
6 thereof would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.

7
8 Section 940. No Conflict with Federal or State Law. Nothing in this ordinance shall be
9 interpreted or applied so as to create any requirement, power, or duty in conflict with any
10 federal or state law.

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REVISED LEGISLATIVE DIGEST
(Amended in Committee, 6/25/2025)

[Funding Reallocation - Our City, Our Home Homelessness Gross Receipts Tax - Services to Address Homelessness - \$34,777,000 Plus Up to \$19,100,000 of Future Revenue - Through FY 2026-27]

Ordinance authorizing the City to reallocate approximately \$34,777,000 in prior appropriated revenue and unappropriated earned interest within the Our City, Our Home (“OCOH”) Fund, to allow the City to use revenues from the Homelessness Gross Receipts Tax through Fiscal Year (FY) 2026-27 for certain types of services to address homelessness, notwithstanding the expenditure percentages set forth in Business and Tax Regulations Code, Section 2810; where future revenue and interest to the OCOH Fund exceeds amounts appropriated in the adopted budget for fiscal years 2025-2026 and 2026-2027, authorizing the City to expend up to \$19,100,000 of such additional revenues and interest on any programs to address homelessness as described in Business and Tax Regulations Code, Section 2810, without regard to the expenditure percentages in that section; temporarily suspending the limit on funding for short-term rental subsidies; and finding that these reallocations are necessary to achieve the purposes of the Our City, Our Home Fund pursuant to Business and Tax Regulations Code, Section 2811.

Existing Law

November 2018’s Proposition C, codified at Article 28 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code, imposed a Homelessness Gross Receipts Tax to help fund programs to prevent and address homelessness. The City deposits the proceeds of this tax in the Our City, Our Home (“OCOH”) Fund. The City may use the OCOH Fund on four “eligible programs,” as follows:

- At least 50% for permanent housing, of which up to 12% may fund short-term rental subsidies, at least 20% must support homeless youth aged 18 through 29, and at least 25% must support homeless families with children under 18.
- Up to 10% for shelters and hygiene programs.
- Up to 15% for homelessness prevention.
- At least 25% for mental health for homeless individuals.

The Board of Supervisors may amend Article 28 by ordinance, by a two-thirds vote and only to further the overall findings and intent of Proposition C.

Amendments to Current Law

The ordinance would authorize an \$34,777,000 OCOH funding increase across Fiscal Years 2025-26 and 2026-27 for shelter and hygiene programs, despite the expenditure percentages that would otherwise apply to that category. The ordinance lists hotel vouchers for families and for domestic violence victims, and improved shelter capacity, as examples of the kinds of shelter programs the funding increase could cover. The City would pay for the increase by reallocating existing unprogrammed OCOH funds and earned interest that will have accrued in the Fund, from the categories of general permanent housing (\$18,386,000), permanent housing for homeless youth aged 18 through 29 (\$10,586,000), and permanent housing for homeless families with children (\$5,805,000). The ordinance would also allow expenditures above the 12% cap for short-term rental subsidies.

If the revenues and interest deposited in the OCOH Fund exceed amounts appropriated in the adopted budget for fiscal years 2025-26 and 2026-27, the ordinance would also authorize the City to expend up to \$19,100,000 of such additional interest and revenue (subject to appropriation), among any or all of the eligible programs to address or prevent homelessness described above, notwithstanding the specific percentage allocations that would otherwise apply.

Background Information

The ordinance reallocates current and future OCOH Funds that are available in large part because the City obtained approximately \$100 million in state grants for permanent housing, including projects dedicated to families and transitional age youth. The original percentage allocations in Section 2810 are based estimates of annual revenue and did not anticipate these additional revenues and accrued interest earnings. Given the current state of the homelessness crisis, it is necessary to reallocate funds to where they are most needed.

MANDATE STATEMENT

Charter Section 2.105 requires that legislative acts be accomplished by ordinance, subject to approval by a majority of the Board of Supervisors.

Business and Tax Regulations Code Section 2811 states that amendments to the Homeless Gross Receipts Tax are subject to Board of Supervisors approval by a two-thirds vote. Such amendments may only be to further the purpose of the tax.

BACKGROUND

The Homelessness Gross Receipts Tax was authorized by voters in November 2018 with the passage of Proposition C and became effective in January 2019. The tax added between 0.175% to 0.69%, depending on the business type, to the gross receipts tax on businesses earning over \$50 million in a given year. The tax was adjusted by Proposition M (November 2024), which lowered the eligibility threshold from \$50 million to \$25 million in annual gross receipts and adjusted the tax rate to 0.164% to 1.64%, depending on the type of business and annual revenues in San Francisco.

In general, under current law, expenditures of Homelessness Gross Receipts Tax revenues must be spent in the following manner:

- At least 50 percent on permanent housing
 - Of which, at least 20 percent must be spent on transitional aged youth (TAY), defined as under age 30
 - Of which, at least 25 percent must be spent on family housing
 - Of which, the remaining portion must be spent on general housing, serving all populations
 - Of which, no more than 12 percent can be spent on short-term (less than five-year) rental subsidies
- Up to 10 percent on shelter and hygiene programs
- Up to 15 percent on prevention programs
- At least 25 percent on mental health services

Prior Board Actions

In July 2023, the Board of Supervisors approved an ordinance (File 23-0657) that allowed use of up to \$16,360,000 in interest earnings from the Homelessness Gross Receipts Tax fund to fund programming outside of the spending requirements outlined above. The programming amounts in FY 2023-24 were \$4.6 million for prevention and \$1.34 million for shelter. The 2023 ordinance also provided a waiver for the 12 percent cap on short-term rental subsidies for FY 2023-24 and FY 2024-25.

In July 2024, the Board of Supervisors approved an ordinance that allowed use of up to \$16,676,000 in interest earnings for shelter and rapid rehousing for families (File 24-0607).

DETAILS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

The proposed ordinance would make the following changes to the programmatic allocation requirements for Homelessness Gross Receipt Tax revenue, interest, and unappropriated fund balance for three years, in FY 2025-26, FY 2026-27, and FY 2027-28:

1. Reallocate \$88.5 million in interest revenue and unencumbered fund balance that would otherwise be spent on housing and prevention programs to shelter programs.
2. Suspend all programmatic allocation requirements for new homeless gross receipt tax revenues. During that time, such revenues could be spent on any program addressing homelessness.
3. Suspend the 12 percent spending cap on short-term rental subsidies.

Approval of the proposed ordinance requires at least eight votes from Board of Supervisors, per Article 28 of the Business Tax and Regulations Code.

Shelter Expansion

The purpose of reallocating Homelessness Gross Receipts Tax revenues is, in part, to fund the Mayor's *Breaking the Cycle* initiative, which aims to temporarily expand the number of shelter and treatment beds over the next three fiscal years. The Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (HSH) reports that the plan includes 630 new shelters and treatment beds across all funding sources. While the Budget and Legislative Analyst's Office has received an overview of the plan, it has not received the underlying analysis that supports it.

According to HSH, the shelter expansion budget includes the following:

- Expansion of existing shelter sites (e.g., the Jerrold Avenue conversion from RVs to congregate shelter, and additional beds in the Bayshore Navigation Center)
- An extension of 110 emergency hotel voucher slots originally funded through the Safer Families Initiative
- 10 emergency hotel voucher slots for victims of domestic violence
- A sober shelter site at the Sharon Hotel on 6th Street
- 448 additional beds, for which the service composition is still to be determined

Certain sites will receive services from both HSH and the Department of Public Health (DPH).

HSH estimates the shelter expansion initiative will cost \$121 million over three years across all funding sources. Of that amount, \$88.5 million would be funded by reallocated interest earnings and the unappropriated fund balance from the Our City, Our Home Fund. The remaining \$32.5 million would be funded through a combination of Our City, Our Home revenues, reallocated General Fund spending, and state grants.

Rental Subsidies

According to HSH, suspending the rental subsidy cap would allow the Department to continue and expand the current level of service for rapid rehousing subsidies, which are limited to three years for adults and five years for families. The proposed budget includes the following increases to rental subsidies:

- 65 new slots for families living in RVs
- 40 new slots for Transition Age Youth (TAY) as part of the Rising Up Program in FY 2025–26
- Extension of 235 adult subsidy slots that would otherwise expire in FY 2026–27

Suspension of Programmatic Allocation Requirements

The proposed ordinance allows any new Homelessness Gross Receipt tax revenue to be spent on any program addressing homelessness through FY 2027-28. According to HSH budget staff, the reallocation of interest and fund balance outlined above is the only spending of Homelessness Gross Receipts tax revenue that does not conform to current program allocation requirements. However, this provision in the proposed ordinance would allow the Mayor and Board to reallocate additional funding, including funding for existing programs, simply as a budget action.

FISCAL IMPACT

Exhibit 1 below shows HSH’s planned use of interest earnings and fund balance, as detailed in the ordinance. The legislation would allow for this money to be spent on shelter rather than prevention and housing programs.

- **Suspends 12%** cap on short-term (<5 years) rental subsidies.
- Authorizes the City to **expend future OCOH Fund revenue through FY25-27** on any eligible programs, rather than allocating funds based on expenditure percentages specified in the tax code subject to the Board's approval of the Annual Appropriations Ordinance.

My name is Lauren Valles, and I write to you today as a member of the San Francisco Young Democrats to express my strong support for the proposals introduced this budget cycle to fully fund behavioral health treatment beds for San Franciscans with the most acute needs. The San Francisco Democratic County Central Committee (DCCC) has already passed a resolution in support of this critical investment.

I commend Mayor Lurie for securing a grant to fund 73 new behavioral health treatment beds—an important step forward. However, the Residential Care and Treatment Bed Workgroup has clearly identified a need for at least 135 additional beds to address the crisis adequately. Stopping short of that full need would mean leaving vulnerable residents without the care they deserve.

During my time as a community organizer in last year's local election, I met a neighbor named Jesus. He shared the story of a friend who sought help at one of San Francisco's existing behavioral health sites. My husband and I worked as campaign volunteers for Proposition C, "Our City, Our Home," in order to create more *housing* for people who might otherwise be stuck in the vicious circles of homelessness.

We understood that we were working for a measure help people to *escape* from homelessness into the greater dignity and legal protections of subsidized tenancy. We very definitely were NOT working to trap even more people inside of San Francisco's demeaning, life-eroding homelessness management system.

I'm informed that Mayor Lurie and far too many of the Supervisors are now trying to abrogate the terms of the law that we worked to pass. Reportedly they now want to divert the Proposition C housing funding into funding for shelter beds.

Taking away that housing money to expand the shelter system is both morally wrong and contrary to the intention of the law passed by the voters.

Please consider that, if you expand the shelter system instead of expanding subsidized housing, you are intentionally choosing to treat a larger percentage of San Franciscans as clients to be supervised under rules that reduce their rights -- not as fully free legal persons who have the full legal rights of tenants, who are entitled to decent living conditions, privacy, personal autonomy and respect.

An expanded shelter system segregates its inmates into a "lite-rights" state of exception where they are subject to more scrutiny and intrusion, they are inevitably exposed to both petty and major abuses of power by underpaid, undertrained, under-supervised staff, and overall they are denied full membership in the larger society.

If you are willing to know what kind of shrunken lives you would be condemning more San Franciscans to endure, I assume you can ask the staff and attorneys with the Eviction Defense Collaborative who work with the Shelter Grievance Program. I guarantee you they have seen more preventable misery in this town than anyone should see, let alone endure.

Even worse, an expanded shelter system would in part be used in the city's unjust enclosure campaign against families and individuals who until now have maintained their privacy, independence, dignity and safety by living in RVs -- who the Mayor is now proposing to deprive of their vehicular homes.

It would be nice to think that you have more respect for your constituents and voters than that.

Institutional tutelage is not the best choice for San Francisco's approach to our housing affordability problems, especially when we are all facing alarming national-level intrusions on individuals' rights, freedoms and dignity.

Please do not authorize this misuse of Prop. C funds.

It was great spending time with you this past Sunday at Alice's Pride Breakfast. I'm writing to urge you all to reject **Section 4** of the trailing legislation (File No. 250609) associated with Proposition C, *Our City Our Home* (2018).

Section 4 reads:

“Under the authority in Business and Tax Regulations Code Section 2811, the Board of Supervisors authorizes the City to expend future revenues that will be deposited in the OCOH Fund through fiscal year 2026–27, after addressing the specified costs required under subsections 2810(b)(1) and (2), among any or all of the eligible programs to address or prevent homelessness as described in subsections 2810(b)(3)(A)–(D), notwithstanding the specific percentage allocations that would otherwise apply, subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors by appropriation.”

This language represents a major shift in how Prop C funds could be allocated. My fear is that weakening Prop C's allocation protections will jeopardize this critical funding — not only for LYRIC, but for other frontline community organizations doing this life-saving work.

LGBTQ+ youth need consistent, dedicated investment — not shifting political priorities. Prop C made that possible by creating a stable and protected source of funding. Undermining that stability now will have devastating downstream consequences.

LYRIC was proud to be among the many community organizations that advocated for the passage of Prop C. We've upheld our commitment by expanding housing access, preventing homelessness, and investing in the potential of queer and trans young people. We ask you to uphold your commitment as well — by rejecting Section 4 and protecting the intent of the voters.

In the budget and appropriations meeting on Friday, RPD presented items 13-16 on sources of funding as a binary between keeping the employment and fees (specifically, court fees). This framing is misleading, and they are not mutually exclusive.

Their presentation was made after the public comment, and there was no opportunity to respond. We are not against all the fees, just against unfairly targeting the tennis and pickleball community.

When compared with the other items, the revenue from courts is minimal (~5%) of the revenue on RPD's items 13-16 of the Budget and Appropriations meeting. As mentioned in the public comment, an adjustment of just 30 cents to the Golden Gate parking meters would cover the entire revenue generated from court fees.

This would satisfy all the parties that spoke today, including the employees at the golf course, RPD employees at risk of layoff, and those interested in the continuation of other recreational programs.

We continue to urge you to reject Ordinance -250603 [Park Code - Court Reservations], when better solutions that do not undermine community recreation exist and have been presented.

Ordinance authorizing the City to reallocate approximately \$88,495,000 in prior appropriated revenue and unappropriated earned interest within the Our City, Our Home ("OCOH") Fund, to allow the City to use revenues from the Homelessness Gross Receipts Tax through Fiscal Year 2027-28 for certain types of services to address homelessness, notwithstanding the expenditure percentages set forth in Business and Tax Regulations Code, Section 2810; authorizing the City to expend future revenues deposited in the OCOH Fund through Fiscal Year 2027-28 on any programs to address homelessness as described in Business and Tax Regulations Code, Section 2810, without regard to the expenditure percentages in that section; temporarily suspending the limit on funding for short-term rental subsidies; and finding that these reallocations are necessary to achieve the purposes of the Our City, Our Home Fund pursuant to Business and Tax Regulations Code, Section 2811.
