3	Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Police Department (SFPD) to retroactively		
4	accept and expend a grant augmentation in the amount of \$230,529 from the		
5	Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) for the Anti-Human Trafficking

8	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Police Department applied for and was awarded		
9	\$200,000 in funding from the California Emergency Management Agency (now known as Cal		
10	OES) for the Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force (HF) Program in October 2012 and has now		
11	been awarded a grant augmentation in the amount of \$230,529; and		
12	WHEREAS, The purpose of the grant is to support enforcement activities to expand our		
13	existing multi-disciplinary task forces to improve both the law enforcement response to all		
14	elements of human trafficking and the coordination between disciplines to ensure that a		
15	comprehensive continuum of care is provided to the victims of human trafficking; and		
16	WHEREAS, The original award period of October 1, 2012 through September 30, 2013		
17	is now extended to June 30, 2014; and		
18	WHEREAS, The grant does not include any provision for indirect costs; and		
19	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Police Department is seeking retroactive approval		
20	because it did not receive the grant augmentation notice until November 26, 2013; and		
21	WHEREAS, This grant does not create any new positions, and will not require an		
22	amendment to the Annual Salary Ordinance; now, therefore, be it		
23	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Police Department is authorized to retroactively		
24	accept and expend a grant augmentation from the Cal OES in the amount of \$230,529; and
