## Resolution Declaring March 15, 2001 as "Urban Girls Services Day" in San Francisco.

WHEREAS, A disproportionate number of females are referred to juvenile probation departments for status and other nonviolent offenses compared to their male counterparts; and,

WHEREAS, girls run away from home at a higher rate than boys, and are arrested for curfew and loitering violations more often than boys; and,

WHEREAS, in San Francisco, girls spend more time at Juvenile Hall than boys do because there are few other options available; and,

WHEREAS, it is estimated that 70 percent of girls in the juvenile justice system have histories of abuse; and,

WHEREAS, in San Francisco, 40% of girls between the ages of 10-17 reported that they or a friend had been abused by a boyfriend; and,

WHEREAS, Girls face risk factors that are different from boys because of their gender, and girls needs are overlooked and under treated; and,

WHEREAS: Funding for girls services is at risk due to TANF funds ending in 2003; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby proclaim this 15th Day of March 2001 as "Urban Girls Services Day".
