RESOLUTION NO. 26-0079

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) has provided wastewater treatment and disposal services to the City of Brisbane (Brisbane) and the Guadalupe Valley Municipal Improvement District (District) pursuant to a July 31, 1995, Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement for Sewer Service (JEPA) as authorized by Board of Supervisors Resolution No. 560-95; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the JEPA, Brisbane and the District send their wastewater to SFPUC's combined sewer system for treatment and disposal; and

WHEREAS, The JEPA also sets, among other conditions and terms, the calculation and payment of sewer service rates, wastewater discharge limits, and compliance with federal and state wastewater discharge laws and regulations; and

WHEREAS, The JEPA became effective on July 31, 1995, with a term of 30 years; and

WHEREAS, The parties continue negotiations to execute a new long-term agreement but due to significant updates to sewer rate calculations, changes in regulatory requirements, the inclusion of City of Daly City and Bayshore Sanitary District in negotiations as both agencies also send wastewater to the SFPUC's combined sewer system for treatment and disposal, and unforeseen administrative delays, the parties were unable to timely execute a new long-term agreement; and


WHEREAS, The parties continue to operate under the terms and conditions of the JEPA and, to ensure continuity of service and payments for providing wastewater treatment and disposal services, the parties desire to retroactively extend the term of the JEPA until the earlier of December 31, 2027, or until a new long-term agreement is executed; and

WHEREAS, On May 7, 2026, by Resolution No. 2026-11, Brisbane's City Council, and by Resolution No. 2026-1, the District's Board of Directors, approved the amendment to extend the JEPA; and

WHEREAS, Approval of this amendment to the JEPA does not constitute a project under the California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines Section 15378 because the amendment will not result in a physical change in the environment; now therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, That this Commission hereby approves and, upon approval by the Board of Supervisors and Mayor, authorizes the General Manager to execute the First Amendment to the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement for Sewer Service Between the City and County of San Francisco, the City of Brisbane, and the Guadalupe Valley Municipal Improvement District to retroactively extend the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement by the earlier of December 31, 2027, or until a new long-term agreement for sewer service is executed by the parties.
