7	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
8	Section 1. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by amending		
9	Section 70.2 to read as for	ollows:	
10	SEC. 70.2. MEM	BERSHIP OF GOVERNING BODY.	
11	(a) The	governing body of the Authority shall be composed of 11 members	
12	appointed by the Board of	of Supervisors. All appointments to seats on the governing body of the	
13	Authority that were made p	rior to March 1, 2004, are hereby approved by the Board of Supervisors.	
14	All appointments to seats or	the governing body of the Authority that were made on or after March 1,	
15	2004, without approval of t	he Board of Supervisors are void, and appointments to those now vacant	
16	positions shall be approved	by the Board of Supervisors for the remainder of the three year terms	
17	applicable to each seat. Th	e Board of Supervisors shall solicit recommendations for	
18	appointment of qualified	members through a fair and open process, including reasonable	
19	written notice to, and affording reasonable response time from, members of the general public		
20	and interested persons and organizations. No fewer than 50 percent of the membership shall		
21	be individuals who are current or past users of personal assistance services paid for through		
22	public or private funds or who are recipients of IHSS, referred to in this Chapter as		
23	"consumers."		
24	(b) Mem	bership categories on the governing body shall be as follows:	
25	(1) Two	consumers over the age of 60 years, each authorized to represent	

1	organizations that advocate for aging people with disabilities;	
2	(2)	Two consumers between the ages of 18 and 60 years, each authorized to
3	represent organizations that advocate for younger people with disabilities;	
4	(3)	One consumer at-large over the age of 60 years;
5	(4)	One consumer at-large between the ages of 18 and 60 years;
6	(5)	One worker who provides personal assistance services to a consumer;
7	(6)	One Commissioner from the Human Services Commission,
8	recommended to the Board by the Commission;	
9	(7)	One Commissioner from the Commission on the Aging, recommended to
10	the Board by the Commission;	
11	(8)	One Commissioner from the Health Commission, recommended to the
12	Board by the Commission;	
13	(9)	One member of the Mayor's Disability Council, recommended to the
14	Board by the Council.	
15	(c)	For purposes of Government Code Section 87103, and 2 California Code
16	of Regulations 18703.3, it is hereby found and declared that the persons appointed to this	
17	governing body are appointed to represent and further the interests of the specific economic	
18	interest which an individual member is appointed to represent.	
19	(d)	Initial appointment of both the consumer and worker members shall be
20	made from a list of recommendations based on applications designed by, and submitted to,	
21	the IHSS Task Force of Planning for Elders in the Central City. Succeeding appointments of	
22	consumer and worker members shall be based on a procedure developed by the governing body of the	
23	Authority, within the first six months of operation, after receiving recommendations from the IHSS Task	
24	Force of Planning fo	or Elders in the Central City. The governing body of the Authority may make

1	recommendations to the Board of Supervisors for establishing procedures for consumer and worker		
2	member appointments. Every attempt shall be made to assure that each appointee will be able		
3	to serve the full term to which he or she has been appointed, in order to ensure continuity in		
4	the work of the Authority.		
5	(e) If during his or her term as a member of the governing body of the		
6	Authority, a Human Services, Aging, or Health Commissioner or member of the Mayor's		
7	Disability Council no longer serves on the Commission or Council, the body from which that		
8	member came shall make another recommendation for appointment and notify the Board of		
9	Supervisors of the end of that member's formal service on their respective Commission or on		
10	the Council.		
11	(f) After the terms of the initial period are complete, each appointment to the		
12	governing body shall thereafter be for a three-year term. A member may be reappointed, but		
13	may not serve more than a total of nine consecutive years on the governing body. The initial		
14	appointment periods shall be staggered as follows:		
15	(1) Three one-year terms;		
16	(2) Four two-year terms; and		
17	(3) Four three-year terms.		
18	Upon appointment, members shall draw lots to determine the length of each member's		
19	initial term. Members shall serve without compensation.		
20	(g) Qualified applicants must reside in San Francisco and have: familiarity		
21	with, or knowledge of, personal assistance services; the capacity to understand their role to		
22	aid and assist the Authority in the administration of its duties; and the ability to attend regularly		
23	scheduled meetings, which shall occur only in facilities which meet disability access		

requirements. Those City departments from which Authority members are drawn shall

1	provide appropriate assistance to their respective representative in fulfilling his or her duties to		
2	the Authority. Within the first 90 days, the members of the governing body of the Authority		
3	shall receive orientation and training from the IHSS Task Force of Planning for Elders in the		
4	Central City and the Department of Human Services regarding the functions and duties of the		
5	Authority, current issues related to delivery of IHSS and the responsibilities of the Authority's		
6	governing body. Each subsequent new member shall receive similar orientation and training		
7	from Authority staff within 60 days of appointment.		
8	(h) Regulations governing the grounds for removal from, and use of		
9	alternates on, the governing body shall be proposed by the governing body and submitted to		
10	the Board of Supervisors within 90 days of the date of the first meeting of the governing body.		
11	These regulations and any proposed amendments shall be initiated exclusively by the		
12	governing body and submitted to the Board of Supervisors for review, and shall become		
13	effective within 90 days of the date of receipt by the Board, unless disapproved by the Board		
14	by resolution. In exercising these review powers, the Board of Supervisors may only approve		
15	or disapprove; it may not modify such regulations and proposed amendments.
