[Settlement of Lawsuit - Adam Smith, et al. - \$130,401.66]

Ordinance authorizing settlement of the lawsuit filed by Adam Smith, et al., against the City and County of San Francisco for return of the Expedited Conversion Program fee in the amount of \$130,401.66; the lawsuit was filed on September 28, 2021, in San Francisco Superior Court, Case No. CPF-21-517578; entitled Adam Smith, et al. v. City and County of San Francisco; the lawsuit challenges the Board of Supervisors' denial of Petitioners' application to convert their six-unit building at 424-434 Francisco Street to condominiums under the City's Expedited Conversion Program (Subd. Code, Section 1396.4); the settlement includes return of Petitioners' Expedited Conversion Program fee and waiver of the City's litigation costs; other material terms of the settlement are the parties' agreement to withdraw their respective appeals.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Pursuant to Charter Section 6.102(5), the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the City Attorney to settle the action entitled Adam Smith, et al. v. City and County of San Francisco, San Francisco Superior Court, Case No. CPF-21-517578, First District Court of Appeal, Case No. A168462, by the return of Petitioners' Expedited Conversion Program fee in the amount of \$130,401.66 and waiver of the City's litigation costs in the amount of \$1325.00. The lawsuit involves a challenge to the Board of Supervisors' denial of Petitioners' application to convert their six-unit building at 424–434 Francisco Street to condominiums under the City's Expedited Conversion Program (Subd. Code, § 1396.4), and alleges both abuse of discretion and violation of equal protection rights.

Section 2. The above-named action was filed in San Francisco Superior Court on September 28, 2021, and the following parties were named in the lawsuit: Petitioners Adam
