2019 Active Transportation Program Grant Funds

Summary

San Francisco Public Works requests authorization to accept and expend \$1,971,000 from the 2019 Active Transportation Program to fund the construction of the Public Works' Alemany Interchange Improvements Phase 2 project.

The Alemany Interchange Improvements Phase 2 project will improve safety and accessibility across and along Alemany Boulevard between Putman Street and Bayshore Boulevard where US 101, I-280, San Bruno Avenue, and Bayshore Boulevard intersect. The project includes a new multi-use path for pedestrians and bicyclists, connecting San Bruno Avenue to the Alemany Farmer's Market. Work will involve grading and drainage, new traffic signals, and high visibility crosswalks.

Background

The Active Transportation Program (ATP) was created by Senate Bill 99 (Chapter 359, Statutes of 2013) and Assembly Bill 101 (Chapter 354, Statutes of 2013) to encourage increased use of active modes of transportation, such as biking and walking. The programming capacity for the 2019 ATP is for state fiscal years 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22, and 2022-23.

On May 16, 2018, the California Transportation Commission (CTC) released the 2019 ATP guidelines and call for projects. On July 30, 2018, San Francisco Public Works (SFPW) submitted a 2019 ATP grant application for the construction phase of the Alemany Interchange Improvements Phase 2 project. On January 28, 2019, the CTC adopted the 2019 ATP program of projects, which includes \$1,971,000 in FY 2021-22 for the Alemany Interchange Improvements Phase 2 project. On March 21, 2019, the California Department of Transportation issued an ATP award letter to SFPW for the Alemany Interchange Improvements Phase 2 project.
