15 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

16 Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Section 1.63, to  
17 read as follows:

18 **SEC. 1.63. NEIGHBORHOOD NOTICING ORDINANCE.**

19 (a) The Chief Data Officer (CDO) San Francisco 311 Customer Service Center  
20 ("SF311") shall develop a pilot program for expanding notice of significant projects and permitting  
21 decisions for the convenience of the general public and to facilitate Board oversight. This program will  
22 supplement, rather than replace, other official notice requirements.

23 (b) The program shall consist of a system through which the City sends, by e-mail or  
24 other electronic means and on a periodic basis, information regarding City projects and  
25 permitting decisions to members of the public who sign up for the service, and a website

1 where members of the public may find information from responsible City departments  
2 regarding City projects and permitting decisions for a particular supervisorial district.

3 (c) The target date for starting the pilot program is 12 months after the acquisition of  
4 project resources by the CDO.

5 ~~(b) The first phase of the program will be creation of a website where members of the~~  
6 ~~public may find information from responsible City departments regarding City projects and~~  
7 ~~permitting decisions for a particular supervisorial district. The target date for creation of the~~  
8 ~~website is six months after the effective date of the ordinance adding this Section 1.63 to the~~  
9 ~~Administrative Code.~~

10 ~~(c) The second phase of the program will be creation of a system where the City~~  
11 ~~sends, by e-mail or other electronic means and on a periodic basis, information from the~~  
12 ~~website to members of the public who signed up for the service. The target date for creation~~  
13 ~~of the notification system is twelve months after the effective date of the ordinance adding this~~  
14 ~~Section 1.63 to the Administrative Code.~~

15 (d) The program initially shall cover significant projects and permitting decisions in the areas  
16 of:


- 17 (1) Construction and infrastructure repair work;
- 18 (2) Public health and safety services and facilities; and,
- 19 ~~(3) Environment; and,~~
- 20 (3)(4) Transportation.

21 (e) The program shall not include notices by the Planning Department regarding the following  
22 categories of projects and permitting decisions: Environmental Review, Discretionary Review,  
23 Conditional Use, Planning Code Section 311 ("Residential Permit Review Procedures for RH, RM, and  
24 RTO Districts"), and Planning Code Section 312 ("Permit Review Procedures for All NC, RED, and  
5 Eastern Neighborhoods Mixed Use Districts").

1            (f) All City officers and agencies shall cooperate with the CDO SF314 in the development and  
2 implementation of the program. The CDO Director of SF314 may adopt rules and regulations to  
3 implement this Section 1.63, including, but not limited to, processes and guidelines for City  
4 departments to provide requested information in a compatible format and on a regular schedule to the  
5 CDO SF314. The CDO Director may, in his or her discretion, excuse a City department from  
6 participation in the pilot program, in whole or in part, where the CDO Director determines that it is  
7 not currently feasible to provide the department's notices in machine-readable data formats by  
8 e-mail or other electronic means on a regular basis.

9  
10            Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after  
11 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the  
12 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board  
13 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

**LEGISLATIVE DIGEST**

[Administrative Code - Neighborhood Noticing Ordinance]

**Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to direct the Chief Data Officer to develop a pilot program for expanding public notice of significant projects and permitting decisions in the City, in the areas of construction and infrastructure repair work, public health and safety services and facilities, and transportation.**

Existing Law

Current City law sets public notice requirements for various City actions and decisions, but there is no program that gathers in one place all or most such notices.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposal is an ordinance that would amend the Administrative Code to direct the City's Chief Data Officer ("CDO") to develop a pilot program for expanding public notice of significant projects and permitting decisions. The program would be in addition to, rather than in place of, other official notice requirements.

The program initially would cover significant projects and permitting decisions in the areas of:

- Construction and infrastructure repair work;
- Public health and safety services and facilities; and,
- Transportation.

The program would consist of a system through which the City sent, by e-mail or other electronic means and on a periodic basis, information regarding City projects and permitting decisions to members of the public who signed up for the service, and a website where members of the public could find information from responsible City departments regarding City projects and permitting decisions for a particular supervisorial district. The target date for starting the pilot program would be 12 months after the CDO acquired the necessary resources to implement the ordinance.

The program would not include Planning Department notices for Environmental Review, Discretionary Review, Conditional Use, Planning Code Section 311 Review ("Residential Permit Review Procedures for RH, RM, and RTO Districts"), and Planning Code Section 312 Review ("Permit Review Procedures for All NC, RED, and Eastern Neighborhoods Mixed Use Districts").

The CDO could excuse a City department from participating in the pilot program where it is not currently feasible to provide the department's notices in machine-readable data formats on a regular basis.

## MANDATE STATEMENT

City Charter Section 2.105 states that the Board of Supervisors shall act only by written ordinance or resolution.

## BACKGROUND

The City's municipal codes set public notice requirements for various City actions and decisions, but there is no program that gathers in one place all or most such notices for review by members of the public, Board of Supervisors, or departmental staff.

## DETAILS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

The proposed ordinance amends the Administrative Code to direct the Chief Data Officer in the Mayor's Office to develop a pilot program for expanding public notice of significant projects and permitting decisions.<sup>1</sup> The program would be in addition to, rather than in place of, other official noticing requirements.

The program will consist of a notification system through which the City sends on a periodic basis, by e-mail or other electronic means, information regarding City projects and permitting decisions to members of the public who sign up for the service. It will also consist of a website where members of the public may find information from City departments responsible for significant City projects which need public notice and permitting decisions for a particular supervisorial district.

Initially, the pilot program will cover projects and permitting decisions in the areas of: construction and infrastructure repair work; public health and safety services and facilities; environment, and transportation.

The program will not include Planning Department notices for Environmental Review, Discretionary Review, Conditional Use, Planning Code Section 311 Review ("Residential Permit Review Procedures for Residential Housing (RH), Residential Mixed-Use and Residential Transit-Oriented Districts"), and Planning Code Section 312 Review ("Permit Review Procedures for all Neighborhood Commercial, Residential Enclave District, and Eastern Neighborhoods Mixed Use Districts.")

The Chief Data Officer could exempt a City department from participating in the pilot program where it is not currently feasible to provide the department's public notices by e-mail or other electronic means on a regular basis.

## FISCAL IMPACT

The Chief Data Officer proposes to hire one 1043 IS Senior Engineer, with salary and fringe benefit costs of \$190,024. This position will conduct user research, work with departments to

prepare and automate data, write widgets for new data feeds to CityGram<sup>2</sup>, redeploy a local, branded version of CityGram, and finally, develop a website to combine and summarize data by Supervisorial District. The Chief Data Officer anticipates being able to absorb ongoing costs for the project, such as the annual renewal of the website domain, in her annual budget.

According to the Chief Data Officer, the funding for this program was previously approved by the Board of Supervisors in the amount of \$200,000 and was included in the Department of Administrative Services FY 2015-16 budget.

## RECOMMENDATION

Approve the proposed ordinance.




