The Pacific Heights Residents Association asks that you reappoint Commissioners Kathrin Moore and Hisashi (Bill) Sugaya to the San Francisco Planning Commission for a third term.

PHRA's membership area includes everything from the high density Van Ness corridor RC zoning to outer Broadway's relatively low density RH-1(D) zoning, as well as various neighborhood commercial districts. Commissioner Sugaya, in addition to sharing Commissioner Moore's understanding of neighborhood character and how land use and planning decisions might affect the existing character, brings significant expertise in architecture relevant to historic preservation, and the attendant CEQA issues that must be considered. The Planning Commission regularly considers proposals where the historicity of a building is a critical item, and the appropriate architectural treatment is the key to a successful project;

Commissioner Sugaya's insight has repeatedly demonstrated its value to San Francisco in these cases.

Their combination of technical expertise and experience on the Planning Commission is very valuable, and PHRA urges their reappointment.

The City would be paying hundreds of thousands of dollars, if not millions to bring in their level of expertise. We are most fortunate that these two extremely talented individuals are willing to give of themselves for four more years of service to our City.

Jay Burke: I'm a General Contractor in San Francisco and believe in supporting functional healthy officials. We need more of them.

Olga Kist: The only two commissioners I felt did not rubber stamp the project under the Eastern Neighborhood Plan. They seemed to recognize that there are impacts not covered by the plan and peculiar to the project.

Ellen Koivisto: Because otherwise we'll get the entire city filled with high rises covered with astroturf and flood lighting.

Fredric West: The citizens are losing our voice in City Hall
