3	Resolution urging a Federal Employment Non-Discrimination Act that includes
4	gender identity protections.

6	WHEREAS, In 2007 President Bush pledged to veto the Employment Non
7	Discrimination Act (ENDA) with or without gender identity; and
8	WHEREAS, over 350 national, state, and local LGBT organizations have signed a
9	letter stating that they supported a fully inclusive ENDA and opposed any legislation that
10	leaves anyone behind, while also requesting the Congressional leadership to only introduce a
11	version of ENDA that includes gender identity in their next session; and
12	WHEREAS, The Human Rights Campaign (HRC) supported a non-inclusive ENDA in
13	the last congressional session, without dialogue and discussion with other national LGBT Civi
14	Rights organizations, such as the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force (NGLTF) and the
15	National Center for Lesbian Rights (NCLR);and
16	WHEREAS, The withdrawal of employment protection for individuals based upon
17	gender identity caused tremendous pain for Transgendered persons throughout the United
18	States who felt discarded and marginalized; and
19	WHEREAS, The opportunity exists to unite the LGBT community and advocates for
20	employment non-discrimination by pursuing an ENDA in the 111th Congress that includes
21	protections for gender identity; and
22	WHEREAS, It should be the goal to create meaningful employment non-discrimination
23	legislation that addresses the pervasive and damaging discrimination faced by
24	Transgendered Americans in the workplace; now, therefore, be it,

1	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges all elected officials
	in the City and County of San Francisco, and State legislators to request that the
2	Congressional leadership introduce the Employment Non-Discrimination Act with gender
3	identity protections included; and, be it
4	FURTHER RESOLVED. That the Can Evancions Recard of Currentiagues current all legal
5	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges all local,
6	state, and national Democratic organizations and elected officials to protect lesbians, gay men, bisexuals and transgender people from discrimination by ensuring that a fully inclusive
7	ENDA is introduced, thereby closing a gap and loophole in the existing version of ENDA that
8	bans only sexual orientation discrimination; and, be it
9	band only coxual offernation discrimination, and, so it
10	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors recognizes that
	many members of San Francisco's LGBT Community and elected officials will forgo attending
11	the 2008 Human Rights Campaign Dinner in San Francisco to express disagreement with a
12	strategy that would remove gender identity protections from employment non-discrimination
13	legislation; and
14	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board is requested to send this
15	resolution to the Human Rights Campaign and Members of our local State and Federal
16	elected family urging that every step be taken to ensure that gender identity protection is
17	included in ENDA as it is considered by the 111th Congress
