WHEREAS, The Department of Public Health, Population Health and Prevention, Community Health Promotion and Prevention, has applied for and been awarded a grant from the President and Fellows of Harvard College, Office for Sponsored Research (Harvard), in the amount of \$48,649, for the Violent Injury Research Project: San Francisco Firearm Injury Surveillance System; and,

WHEREAS, Harvard has indicated that it will not agree to any modification to the form of the Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, The Agreement contains certain provisions described below, which require the approval of the Board of Supervisors; and,

WHEREAS, The Agreement does not contain certain provisions described below, which are required under the Administrative Code unless waived by the Board of Supervisors; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Health is hereby authorized to accept retroactively and expend the grant funds pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 10.170-1; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the Agreement on behalf of the City; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the provision in the Agreement pursuant to which the City indemnifies Harvard; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the provision in the Agreement pursuant to which the City agrees to submit all claims arising out of the Agreement to binding arbitration, and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the provision in the Agreement pursuant to which the City agrees to grant a royalty-free, non-exclusive and irrevocable license for the use of data developed under the contract; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED. That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement 21.21 contained in Sections 6.21 and 21.19 of the Administrative Code that the Agreement include an indemnification of the City by Harvard for the infringement of patent rights; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement contained in Section 6.52(c) of the Administrative Code that the Agreement include a paragraph reciting the false claim provisions contained in Section 6.574a) of the Administrative Code; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of Health to enter into similar agreements with Harvard if the grant recurs or is renewed, and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Controller should be urged to designate the position created under the grant as a "G" or grant-funded position, which would terminate when the grant expires.
