The Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee met in regular session on Thursday, April 24, 2025, with Chair Matt Dorsey presiding. Chair Dorsey called the meeting to order at 10:01 a.m.

Hearing to consider that the person-to-person, premise-to-premise transfer of a Type-48 on-sale general beer, wine, and distilled spirits liquor license to Far East Cafe Inc., doing business as Far East Cafe Social Club, located at 627 Grant Avenue (District 3), will serve the public convenience or necessity of the City and County of San Francisco. The applicant submitted a request for a determination on the public convenience or necessity of the transfer of a Type-48 on sale general beer, wine, and distilled spirits liquor license to Far East Cafe Inc., doing business as Far East Cafe Social Club, located at 627 Grant Avenue (District 3).

03/28/25; RECEIVED AND ASSIGNED to Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee.

04/01/25; REFERRED TO DEPARTMENT. Referred to the Planning Department and Police Department for recommendation.

04/02/25; RESPONSE RECEIVED. The Planning Department is recommending approval of the attached ABC Type 48 (On Sale General Public Premises) at 627 Grant Avenue (dba Far East Café) permitted in the CVR Chinatown Visitor's Retail District per Section 180 of the Planning Code. ABC has confirmed that the existing Full Bar and accompanying ABC type 47 license has existed on these premises since Jan. 1965, considered to be continuation of existing use.

04/16/25; RESPONSE RECEIVED. The Police Department submitted a response recommending approval with the following conditions:

- 1. Petitioner(s) shall actively monitor the area under their control in an effort to prevent the loitering of persons on any property adjacent to the licensed premises as depicted on ABC-253.
- 2. The petitioner(s) shall be responsible for maintaining free of litter the area adjacent to the premises over which they have control, as depicted on ABC-253.
- 3. (1) Except as provided in Condition 2 below, no noise shall be audible beyond the area under the control of the licensee. (SF district office only). (2) Any noise caused by entertainment or amplified sound that is subject to the provisions of an active Entertainment Permit issued by the San Francisco Entertainment Commission shall be authorized in accordance with the limits established by that Entertainment Permit, including any limitation on hours during which entertainment or amplified sound is permitted. A violation of the entertainment or amplified sound noise conditions of the Entertainment Permit, as determined by the San Francisco Entertainment Commission (or any successor agency), shall be deemed to be a violation of this Condition. Any noise that is not subject to, or is beyond the scope of, the Entertainment Permit shall be subject to Condition 1 above. "Entertainment Permit" means any of the following: a Just Add Music permit, a Limited Live Performance permit, a Place of Entertainment permit, a Fixed Place Amplified Sound permit, or any similar such permit issued by the San Francisco Entertainment Commission.
- 4. At any time, the premise is providing live entertainment, the petitioner(s) shall have two (2) uniformed security guard(s) on the premises and shall maintain order therein to prevent any activity which would interfere with the quiet enjoyment of their nearby residents, or the surrounding community. The uniform security guards must be licensed by the State of California Department of Consumer Affairs.

Chair Dorsey moved that this Ordinance be AMENDED, AN AMENDMENT OF THE WHOLE BEARING NEW TITLE, on Page 1, Line 1, to read 'Administrative Code - Recovery First Substance Use Disorder Treatment Policy'; on Page 1, Lines 3-6, to read 'Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to establish the long-term remission of substance use disorders for individuals as the primary goal of the City's substance use disorder treatment policy'; throughout the ordinance, by striking 'drug' and inserting 'Substance Use Disorder Treatment'; on Page 1, Lines 23-24, by inserting '(1) "Remission" means overcoming the illness of Substance Use Disorder to the point of living a self-directed and healthy life, free from illicit drug use'; on Page 2, Lines 1-7, to read '(2) "Recovery" means the process by which an individual suffering from Substance Use Disorder strives to make positive changes that become part of a voluntarily adopted healthy lifestyle. Recovery may include participation in: a Medication-Assisted-Treatment program administered by a licensed healthcare provider in accordance with applicable laws and medical guidance; an outpatient or residential substance use treatment program; a contingency management program: or other program determined by the program participant to support their efforts to be in Remission'; on Page 2, Lines 11-14, to read '(c) Policy. Long-term Remission of Substance Use Disorders for individuals, with the help of fully supported and staffed evidence-based Recovery and behavioral health services, shall be the primary goal of the City's Substance Use Disorder treatment policy'; and making other conforming and clerical changes throughout the ordinance text.
