2 **OPPOSING THE REMOVAL AND DESTRUCTION OF PAUL SCOFIELD'S MURAL TITLED**  
3 **"A LEAP OF COMPASSION" LOCATED ON 665 EDDY STREET AND FURTHER URGING**  
4 **CITI PROPERTIES TO ALLOW THE MURAL TO REMAIN AT ITS PRESENT LOCATION OR**  
5 **PERMIT ENOUGH TIME FOR THE REPLICATION AND RELOCATION OF THE MURAL TO**  
6 **A MORE SUITABLE LOCATION.**

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8 WHEREAS, In 1992, Chip Conley, chief executive of Joie de Vivre Hospitality Inc.,  
9 commissioned artist Paul Scofield to create mural on the walls of the 42 unit Phoenix Hotel  
10 located on 665 Eddy Street in the Tenderloin neighborhood; and

11 WHEREAS, The mural, titled "Leap of Compassion", inspired from African, Asian, and  
12 Native American artistic traditions; was dedicated to youth of the Tenderloin;

13 WHEREAS, The mural presents to the viewer that in for humanity as whole to evolve  
14 heal and become empowered, individuals must have faith take leap beyond one's racial,  
15 cultural and national boundaries to see commonality off all people and inter-connectivity of  
16 nature and all phenomenon; and

17 WHEREAS, These unique and invaluable murals throughout San Francisco are being  
18 threatened by advertisers who are willing to pay high rental fees to hotel owners for  
19 advertising space; and

20 WHEREAS, Citi Properties, the new owners of the property located at 665 Eddy Street,  
21 has expressed the intent to remove the mural to replaced by advertisement on north side and  
22 another mural by a different artist on the south side of the building ; and

23 WHEREAS, A 1991 federal statue prohibits removal of murals, privately or public  
24 funded, unless the original artist waives his or her right and unless the work can be separated

1 from the building without damage to the artwork in which case the original artist must be given  
2 90 days notice and the chance to remove the artwork; and

3 WHEREAS, This mural has become part of the cultural landscape of the Tenderloin  
4 and on the cultural landmarks which unite the Tenderloin neighborhood as well an important  
5 and valuable artistic contribution which all San Franciscans can be proud of; and

6 WHEREAS, Paul Scofield's work adds another unique contribution to the great San  
7 Francisco tradition of mural artists and the removal of his work would be great blow to all San  
8 Franciscans, residents of the Tenderloin and the greater arts community; now, therefore, be it

9 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco  
10 strongly opposes the removal and destruction of Paul Scofield's mural titled "A Leap of  
11 Compassion" located on 665 Eddy Street; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors strongly urges the Citi  
13 Properties to allow the mural to remain where it is or permit enough time to safely replace and  
14 relocate the mural to a more suitable location.
