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Motion concurring in the January 9, 2023, Proclamation by the Mayor Declaring the Existence of a Local Emergency in connection with the sudden and severe winter storms that began on December 27, 2022, causing high winds, substantial precipitation, and flooding in the City; and concurring in actions taken to meet the emergency to: 1) require City employees and officers to take all steps requested by the **Executive Director of the Department of Emergency Management ("DEM") to address** the emergency conditions caused by the storms; 2) require all City employees and officers to take all steps requested by the Executive Director of DEM to qualify the City for funding as may be available to reimburse the City for the expenses it incurs in addressing this emergency; and 3) expedite the procurement of services, goods, and public works relating to the emergency by exempting contracts and grants for such services from specific contract requirements, waiving Civil Service Commission approval of such contracts and grants, authorizing departments to purchase professional services through the issuance of a stand-alone purchase order, authorizing department heads or their designees to deviate from the City's standard terms and conditions where necessary to effectively respond to the emergency, and authorizing the procurement of public works as provided in Administrative Code, Section 6.60.

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WHEREAS, On January 9, 2023, Mayor London N. Breed declared a local emergency to exist in connection with the severe winter storms that began on December 27, 2022, causing high winds, substantial precipitation, and flooding in the City; and

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| 2 | Existence of a Local Emergency ("Proclamation") to the Board of Supervisors, and such copy |

| 8 | series of atmospheric river systems that struck California; and |
| 9 | WHEREAS, On the weekend of December 31, 2022, the City experienced a storm with |
| 10 | severe rains and high winds, which caused major flooding, debris flows, and mudslides that |
| 11 | led to road closures; damaged private property, resulting in evacuation of homes and red |
| 12 | tagging of buildings; impacted critical infrastructure including public buildings, healthcare |
| 13 | facilities, and public transit facilities; and caused power outages, including at the City's 911 |
| 14 | operations center and at least one facility serving people experiencing homelessness; and |
| 15 | WHEREAS, Between December 31, 2022 and January 4, 2023, the City's 311 system |
| 16 | received nearly 2,000 inquiries and complaints related to flooding, street conditions, and |
| 17 | damage to trees, light poles, and property; and |
| 18 | WHEREAS, On January 4, 2023, another severe storm hit the City, resulting in |
| 19 | additional flooding, downed trees, downed powerlines, and mudslides, road closures and |
