To the membership committee of CPAC,


I am submitting my application to become a member of CPAC and I thank you in advance for considering my application. For the last eleven years I have been residing in District 9 and have been working with children and families in the neighborhood. I am also a mother raising two young children in the neighborhood and am a current consumer of childcare. It was four years ago, when I was pregnant with my first child that I began participating in CPAC meetings as an interested member of the community. It would be an honor to join CPAC now and contribute as an advocate for high quality childcare in our city and beyond.

As a mother and consumer of childcare, I value deeply the quality of care that my own children receive as well as the right to and availability of high quality options for all families. My family is deeply rooted in the neighborhood and I see everyday the high need that our families face regarding economic justice and access to services. I have been a consumer of family based care as well as center based, my son being currently enrolled in a cooperative preschool (Centro Las Olas). I am a working parent at his school and a member of the Board of Directors. My daughter will be in family child care before beginning school at Las Olas in 2014.

In my professional life, I have been in the field of education for the last fifteen years, here in the US and abroad. I have worked as a classroom teacher at the elementary level and have extensive experience with staff capacity building trainings. I received training in Early Childhood Education from Cal State East Bay and worked, among other schools, at what is now Blue Skies Preschool in Oakland. It was there that I became actively involved in advocacy campaigns including the Worthy Wage campaign. For the last four years I have been at Jamestown Community Center as the Early Education Specialist, managing programs for Latino children 0-5 and their families. Through Jamestown I also sit on the Jamestown Strategic Planning and Implementation Committee, The San Francisco Early Literacy Network and the Early Education Workgroup of Mission Promise Neighborhoods. I recently formalized my staff trainings by co-founding Pulsing Word Consulting. Through Pulsing Word I am currently working with the SF public library to develop workshops for their Early Educator Workshop Series, as well as the Teen Pregnancy Project, Children's Book Project and other CBO's and schools. In all of the professional settings, I have worked closely with staff and families from diverse backgrounds regarding race, economic status, immigration status and sexual orientation. I also have formal training as a cultural mediator/interpreter and in conflict management.

Regarding my personal life, I was raised by social justice advocates who were both in the field of education. It makes up a large part of my value system and has been a central part of my life since my youth. I consider the main responsibilities of a leader to be the ability to listen with an open mind and heart, and the ability to face discomfort with humility and hope. It is those qualities that I aspire to embody is whatever role of leadership that I am honored with. For the past nine years I have been a member of the organization Critical Resistance, volunteering to create alternatives to prison and policing. I have experience in supporting both global and national struggles related to immigration and policing, as well as local struggles to unionize teaching staff, expand diversity in the workplace, create community responses to harm and supported the campaigns of a handful of candidates for the SF Board of Supervisors.

As part of CPAC, I am particularly interested in workforce development and issues of civic engagement for non-English speaking families and providers. I would like to support current efforts for deepening parent engagement at both family based and center based sites, and look at how to track and create evidence to sustain these practices. I would also like to look at how quality ratings and city recommendations are used by families and how to improve these channels of information. I am very committed to looking at the needs of non-licensed providers and how to involve them in city wide campaigns and training.

Board Qualifications:

The Child Care Planning and Advisory Council consists of 25 members. The Board of Supervisors appoint 12 members, one each of whom is nominated by an individual member of the Board, and a second being nominated by the President of the Board.. The Board of Education or County Superintendent of Schools, if the Board of Education delegates the appointment power to her or him, shall appoint the remaining 12 members and the Board of Supervisors and the Board of Education, or County Superintendent of Schools, if the Board of Education delegates the appointment power to her or him, shall jointly appoint 1 member. The members appointed by the Board of Supervisors shall be representative of the following categories: A) Parents, guardians or caretakers with varied income levels who use child care and/or early education services, including but not limited to clients of publicly subsidized programs such as CalWORKS, and other child care programs funded through the San Francisco Human Services Agency, the California Department of Education, Head Start or Preschool for All B) Child Care Providers - Private and subsidized child care providers including, but not limited to, from a private center, from a family day care home, a Title 5 program, a school age program, from a Head Start center and from a Preschool for All site. C) Discretionary: representatives of the public at large and/or representatives from any of the other categories, or outside of these categories at the discretion of the appointing agencies D) Community representatives: Parent advisory councils of public and private child care programs; associations of child care providers, family child care providers and Head Start; City College of San

Francisco, San Francisco State University, public interest organizations including, but not limited to, the Child Care Law Center, Low Income Investment Fund community organizations, members of labor organizations and local businesses that fall within the definition of "community representative" as described in Subsection (d)(1) (B) and other community and public agency representatives that deal with child care. E)Public Agency Representatives: Representative from two of the following agencies - the Department of Children, Youth and their Families, Human Services Agency, San Francisco Children and Families Commission, Community Care Licensing, Department of Public Health, Recreation and Parks Department, Mayor's Office of Community Investment and San Francisco Housing Authority, or other entities.

The Council is established to advise the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, the SF Children and Families Commission and, with their consent, the Board of Education and the Superintendent of Schools about child care issues. The Council will serve as a representative advisory and planning body to maintain, expand and improve local child care services. The Council will provide links between government and the community, and will work to maximize the amount and impact of local State, federal and private resources and funding for child care in San Francisco. Powers and Duties are outlined in Administrative Code section 5.200.

All terms shall be for three years. Members may serve for up to two consecutive terms, and may be re-appointed after one year off the Council. No terms served prior to March 8, 2010 shall be counted towards the term limit for Council members. A member appointed to serve a term of two years or less, including the initial term provided in the preceding paragraph, shall not be deemed to have served a full term for purposes of this term limit.

Compensation: Upon approval by the Council, each member who is not otherwise compensated to attend meetings may receive a stipend of no more than \$50 per meeting, not to exceed \$300 annually, exclusively from funds provided to the Council by the State of California.
