[Accept and Expend Grant - Office of Financial Empowerment Kindergarten to College Outreach Position - Up to \$80,000]

Ordinance authorizing the Office of the Treasurer-Tax Collector to accept and expend a grant in the amount of up to \$80,000 from the Earned Assets Resource Network for implementing the Office of Financial Empowerment Kindergarten to College program, and amending Ordinance 165-12 (Annual Salary Ordinance, FYs 2012-2013 and 2013-2014) to provide for the creation of one (1) grant-funded position in the Office of Financial Empowerment.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco: Section 1. Findings.

- (a) The Office of Financial Empowerment in the Office of the Treasurer-Tax

  Collector was awarded an up to \$80,000 grant from the Earned Assets Resource Network on

  August 7, 2012. The purpose of the grant is to hire and provide funding for a staff position to

  conduct outreach to families in the Kindergarten to College program.
- (b) The City and County of San Francisco established the Kindergarten to College program in 2010 to provide college savings accounts for San Francisco Unified School District kindergarteners with an initial deposit of \$50, provide financial education curriculum, and encourage savings for higher education.

Section 2. Authorization to accept and expend grant funds.

- (a) The Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Office of the Treasurer-Tax Collector to accept and expend, on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, funds from the Earned Assets Resource Network in the amount of \$80,000 for the purpose of implementing the Office of Financial Empowerment Kindergarten to College program.
- (b) Whereas the Department proposes to maximize use of available grant funding on direct services by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it
