9	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
10	Section 1. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by repealing
11	Sections 15.17 and 151.9, in their entirety.
12	SEC. 15.17. DRUG ABUSE ADVISORY BOARD.
13	(a) Establishment of Drug Abuse Advisory Board. Pursuant to Section 11964 of the California
14	Health and Safety Code there is hereby created an Advisory Board of 15 members known as the Drug
15	Abuse Advisory Board, who shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors and who shall serve
16	without compensation.
17	(b) Composition. Members of the Advisory Board shall be residents of the City and County of
18	San Francisco who have a professional interest in or a personal commitment to alleviating drug abuse.
19	Membership shall include representatives from various social, economic and occupational groups and
20	shall be broadly representative of the demographic characteristics of San Francisco. Appointments to
21	the Advisory Board shall reflect public policy favoring a broadly constituted membership that reflects
22	the diversity of the general public of San Francisco, including ethnic minorities, women, and persons
23	from varying economic levels. Membership shall be drawn from all areas of the City and County. Two
24	members shall be from law enforcement and at least two but no more than five shall be drug abuse
25	treatment providers. The remaining members shall be from the general public.

1	(c) Restrictions on Membership.
2	(1) The Advisory Board shall not include any person or his or her spouse who is any of the
3	following:
4	(A) A member of the Board of Supervisors or a person on the staff of a member of the Board of
5	Supervisors;
6	(B) An employee of the Department of Public Health, including a therapist or counselor who is
7	paid by the Department or who works at a Department clinic.
8	(2) The Advisory Board shall not include in excess of 33-1/3 percent of its membership any
9	person or his or her spouse who is any of the following:
10	(A) A member of a board of directors or advisory board or employee of any City and County
11	operated or City and County contract provider of drug services, or of any program approved pursuant
12	to Section 11876 of the California Health and Safety Code (methadone program);
13	(B) A direct recipient of any State funds allocated for drug programs under Part 3 of Division
14	10.5 of the California Health and Safety Code pursuant to a contract with the State Department of
15	Health Services which shall include compensation for contracted service or membership on an advisor
16	body or board of directors of such recipient agency.
17	(d) Term of Membership. The term of each membership shall be three years. Vacancies on the
18	Advisory Board shall be filled for the unexpired term of the membership position which becomes
19	vacant.
20	(c) Termination of Membership.
21	(1) Membership on the Advisory Board shall terminate with expiration of the term to which the
22	member was appointed or if the member ceases to maintain the status which qualified him or her for
23	appointment, except that the member may continue to serve until a successor is appointed.
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1	(2) A member of the Advisory Board shall be deemed to have resigned his or her membership if
2	he or she fails to attend regular meetings of the Advisory Board for three consecutive months unless the
3	absences are excused by a majority vote of the Advisory Board.
4	(3) The Advisory Board may adopt standards for removing members for cause, which
5	standards must:
6	(A) Be consistent with the provisions of Section 11964 of the California Health and Safety
7	Code; and
8	(B) Be approved by the Board of Supervisors.
9	(f) Frequency and Conduct of Meetings. The Advisory Board shall meet at least monthly and
10	may meet at such other times as may be deemed necessary by the chair or the county's Drug Program
11	Administrator. Meetings of the Advisory Board shall be open to the public and subject to the provisions
12	of the Ralph M. Brown Act, Sections 54950 et seq. of the California Government Code and the
13	Sunshine Ordinance, San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 67.
14	(g) Duties. The Advisory Board shall coordinate its efforts, where appropriate, with San
15	Francisco's other advisory boards concerned with drug problems and shall perform the duties specified
16	in Section 11965(k) of the California Health and Safety Code. In addition, the Advisory Board shall
17	issue written recommendations regarding the funding of proposals for services received by the county's
18	Drug Program Administrator.
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20	SEC. 15.19. CITY-WIDE ALCOHOLISM ADVISORY BOARD.
21	(a) Establishment of City-Wide Alcoholism Advisory Board. Pursuant to Section 11805 of the
22	California Health and Safety Code there is hereby created an Advisory Board of 15 members known as
23	the City Wide Alcoholism Advisory Board, who shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors and
24	who shall serve without compensation.

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1	(b) Composition. Members of the Advisory Board shall be residents of the City and County of
2	San Francisco who have a professional interest in and personal commitment to alleviating alcohol
3	abuse. Membership shall include representatives from various social, economic and occupational
4	groups and shall be broadly representative of the demographic characteristics of San Francisco.
5	Membership shall be drawn from all areas of the City and County.
6	(c) Restrictions on Membership.
7	(1) The Advisory Board shall not include any person or his or her spouse who is any of the
8	following:
9	(A) A member of the Board of Supervisors or a person on the staff of a member of the Board of
10	Supervisors;
11	(B) An employee of the City and County of San Francisco Department of Public Health,
12	including a therapist or counselor who is paid by the Department or who works at a Department clinic.
13	(C) A member of a board of directors or advisory board or employee of any City and County
14	operated or City and County contract provider of alcoholism services.
15	(d) Term of Membership. The term of each membership shall be three years. Vacancies on
16	the Advisory Board shall be filled for the unexpired term of the membership position which becomes
17	vacant.
18	(e) Termination of Membership.
19	(1) Membership on the Advisory Board shall terminate with expiration of the term to which the
20	member was a appointed or if the member ceases to maintain the status which qualified him or her for
21	a appointment, except that the member may continue to serve until a successor is appointed.
22	(2) A member of the Advisory Board shall be deemed to have resigned his or her membership if
23	he or she fails to attend regular meetings of the Advisory Board for three consecutive months unless
24	the absences are excused by a majority vote of the Advisory Board.

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1	(3) The Advisory Board may adopt standards for removing members for cause. These
2	standards must be approved by the Board of Supervisors.
3	(f) Frequency and Conduct of Meetings. The Advisory Board shall meet at least monthly and
4	may meet at such other times as may be deemed necessary by the chair or the Director of Health or his
5	or her designee. Meetings of the Advisory Board shall be open to the public and subject to the
6	provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act, Sections 54950 et seq. of the California Government Code and
7	the Sunshine Ordinance, Chapter 67 of the San Francisco Administrative Code.
8	(g) Duties. The Advisory Board shall coordinate its efforts where appropriate, with San
9	Francisco's other advisory boards concerned with substance abuse problems and shall provide
10	community participation in the planning, budgeting, and monitoring of the City and County's alcohol-
11	related services.
