URGING AMERICA ONLINE (AOL) TO CREATE STANDARDS SENSITIVE TO THE LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL AND TRANSGENDER COMMUNITY AND TO END THEIR PRACTICE OF CENSORING GAY CONTENT MUCH MORE FREQUENTLY THAN CONTENT THAT INCLUDES PROFANITIES, SEXUAL CONTENT OR HATE SPEECH BY NON-GAY MEMBERS.

WHEREAS, Recently, America Online (AOL) has been accused of censoring the way gay members describe themselves online while ignoring gay-bashing remarks from other members; and,

WHEREAS, The American Civil Liberties Union, NationalGayLobby.Org and Hate Watch criticized AOL on their Web sites for preventing a gay member from including sexually suggestive information about himself in his personal profile, while allowing other members to litter their profiles with racist comments and hate rhetoric; and,

WHEREAS, AOL members typically create profiles to publicly describe themselves and their interests; and,

WHEREAS, AOL recently deleted the profile of a gay man, informing the member that his description violated the company's terms of service agreement, which states, "It is essential that (content created by members) reflects our community standards, and we may remove it if, in our best judgment, it does not meet those standards"; and,

WHEREAS, It has been reported that of the profiles censored by AOL, the majority had been deleted because of gay content; and,

WHEREAS, In addition, AOL has software that automatically censors racial slurs against many ethnic groups, but has no policy or software that deletes hate speech against gays and lesbians, some of which has been found to be very threatening; and,

WHEREAS, AOL has a responsibility to be more proactive about fighting hate speech and to create policies that apply to all groups and communities; and,

WHEREAS, AOL's awareness and sensitivity to the gay community has been questioned before when one of its employees turned over a gay member's name to a Navy investigator who then initiated discharge proceedings against the serviceman; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco urges America Online (AOL) to create standards sensitive to the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender community and to end their practice of censoring gay content much more frequently than content that includes profanities, sexual content or hate speech by non-gay members.
