

1 [Jack Early Commemorative Plaque - Stockton Street Adjacent to Washington Square]

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3 **Ordinance commemorating the Stockton Street sidewalk adjacent to Washington**
4 **Square Park under Public Works Code Sections 789 et seq., the Commemorative Street**
5 **Plaque Ordinance, accepting a plaque in honor of Jack Early as a gift to the City,**
6 **waiving permit and inspection fees for plaque installation, and directing official acts in**
7 **furtherance of this Ordinance.**

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12 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

13 Section 1. Findings.

14 (a) Upon his death, Mr. Jack Early bequest 5 large (48” box) evergreen trees to the
15 City and County of San Francisco. The Telegraph Hill Dwellers Association honored this
16 request and together with the City’s Recreation and Park Department, planted these trees at
17 Washington Square Park in May 2011.

18 (b) The sidewalk on Stockton Street near Filbert Street and adjacent to Washington
19 Square Park shall commemorate Mr. Early’s contribution to San Francisco and Washington
20 Square Park.

21 Section 2. Commemoration of Jack Early.

22 The Board of Supervisors declares its intent to commemorate the Stockton Street
23 sidewalk near Filbert Street and adjacent to Washington Square Park in accordance with
24 Public Works Code Sections 789 et seq., the Commemorative Street Plaque Ordinance, in
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1 honor of Jack Early and to authorize the installation of a plaque at that location for this
2 purpose.

3 Section 3. Gift Acceptance.

4 (a) The Board of Supervisors accepts a commemorative plaque in honor of Mr. Early
5 as a gift to the City and County of San Francisco.

6 (b) On August 21, 2012, the Civic Design Review Committee of the Arts Commission
7 notified the Department of Public Works that the subject plaque received its approval.

8 Section 4. Fee Waiver.

9 Notwithstanding any contrary provision of the Public Works Code, the Board of
10 Supervisors hereby waives all permit and inspection fees associated with the installation of
11 the commemorative plaque.

12 Section 5. Requested Official Actions.

13 (a) The Board of Supervisors directs the Department of Public Works to take all
14 actions necessary to implement the intent of this Ordinance, including approval of the
15 installation of the aforementioned plaque.

16 (b) The Board of Supervisors directs the Department of Public Works to add the
17 subject sidewalk and plaque to the Official City Map of commemorative sites.

18 Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days from the
19 date of passage.
