11 WHEREAS, Mark Bittner has spent the past ten years as the self-appointed caretaker
12 of these parrots; and,

13 WHEREAS, The wild parrots of San Francisco have come to rely on Mark Bittner's
14 warmth, caring, and thoughtful stewardship; and,

15 WHEREAS, Mark Bittner is leaving San Francisco and will be missed by his parrots
16 and the other residents of San Francisco in equal measure; now, therefore, be it

17 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
18 declares its respect for and appreciation and support of the presence and well-being of the
19 wild parrot flock of San Francisco.




