Ordinance authorizing settlement of the lawsuit filed by Pacific States Environmental Contractors, Inc. against the City and County of San Francisco for \$425,000; the lawsuit was filed on November 20, 2009 in San Mateo County Superior Court and subsequently transferred to San Francisco County Superior Court, Case No. CGC-10-501403, entitled Pacific States Environmental Contractors, Inc. v. City and County of San Francisco, et al.", San Francisco County Superior Court, Case No. CGC-10-501403, by the payment of \$425,000; mutual releases except for latent defects, dismissal of the complaint with prejudice, and each side to bear its own attorneys fees and costs.
