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3	Resolution authorizing the Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco to
4	retroactively accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$1,609,555 from the U.S.
5	Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance, to administer the Local Law
6	Enforcement Block Grant Program.
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8	WHEREAS, The Omnibus Appropriations Act of 1996 establishes the Local Law
9	Enforcement Block Grant Program (LLEBG) under the authority of the U.S. Department of
10	Justice; and
11	WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance, announced
12	that online applications would be accepted beginning June 5, 2002 and ending July 17, 2002
13	for the Fiscal Year 2002 Local Law Enforcement Block Grant Program to support local efforts
14	to reduce crime and increase public safety; and,
15	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco can utilize Local Law Enforcement
16	Block Grant funds for four Federal purpose areas: supporting overtime for law enforcement
17	officers, community crime prevention, the support and development of Drug Courts, and the
18	enhancement of adjudication for violent offenders; and,
19	WHEREAS, Before any expenditure or obligation LLEBG funds, an Advisory Board
20	must first make non-binding recommendations to the Mayor as to the use of those funds, the
21	Mayor acting through the Director of the Mayor's Criminal Justice Council, Office of Criminal
22	<u>Justice</u> convened the required Advisory Board made up of representatives from the Police
23	and Sheriff's Departments, the Courts, the District Attorney, the School District, the Adult
24	Probation Department, the Public Defender, the Health Department, and nonprofit groups
25	active in crime prevention, and received the Advisory Board's recommendations; and,

1	WHEREAS, Indirect costs are not allowable costs for the LLEBG program and
2	therefore are not included in the grant budget; and,
3	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has been awarded a grant in the
4	amount of \$1,609,555 by the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance, to
5	support local efforts to reduce crime and increase public safety; now, therefore, be it
6	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Mayor to
7	retroactively accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$1,609,555 from the U.S.
8	Department of Justice to support local efforts to reduce crime and increase public safety; and,
9	be it
10	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of
11	indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it
12	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller designate 6.99FTE positions as "G", grant-
13	funded, to terminate when the grant expires; and, be it
14	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco will adhere to the
15	requirements and conditions of the grant award agreement with the U.S. Department of
16	Justice.
