16	proposed boundaries map for the district; ordering and setting a time and place for a public
17	hearing of the Board of Supervisors, sitting as a Committee of the Whole, on July 22, 2025 at
18	3:00 p.m.; approving the form of the Notice of Public Hearing and Assessment Ballot
19	Proceeding, and Assessment Ballot; directing environmental findings; and directing the Clerk
20	of the Board of Supervisors to give notice of the public hearing and balloting as required by
21	law." (the "Resolution of Intention, "BOS File No); and
22	WHEREAS, The Dogpatch & Northwest Potrero Hill Green Benefit District (GBD)
23	Management District Plan (the "Management Plan") dated, the Dogpatch and
24	Northwest Potrero Hill Green Benefit District Engineer's Report, dated and the Notice of

WHEREAS, If the proposed District is renewed and expanded, assessments would be levied against all parcels of real property in the proposed District and collected for a period of 15 years, commencing with Fiscal Years (FYs) 2025-2026 through 2039-2040; and

WHEREAS, Article XIIID, Section 4 of the California Constitution provides that parcels within an assessment district that are owned or used by any government agency, the State of California or the United States shall not be exempt from assessment unless the agency can demonstrate by clear and convincing evidence that those publicly owned parcels in fact receive no special benefit; and

WHEREAS, The City owns certain parcels of real property within the District ("the City Property") that would receive special benefits from the District, as set forth in the Engineer's Report and Management Plan; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors has jurisdiction over nine of the parcels that are City Property, which are listed in the following chart along with the proposed assessment amount for each parcel, and the percent of the total proposed assessments for the District that each parcel would be assessed (which is the corresponding weight to be afforded the City's signature on the ballot to establish the Dogpatch and Northwest Potrero Hill GBD):
