

1 [Authorizing preparation of Proponent/Opponent ballot arguments and rebuttal ballot  
2 arguments for submittal to the voters at the November 6, 2007 Election.]

3 **Motion authorizing preparation of written Proponent and Opponent ballot arguments**  
4 **and rebuttal ballot arguments for Charter Amendments approved by the Board of**  
5 **Supervisors for submittal to the voters at the November 6, 2007 Election.**

6 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors has approved Charter Amendments for  
7 submittal to the voters at the November 6, 2007 Election in the City and County of San  
8 Francisco; and

9 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors wishes to authorize the sponsors of the  
10 following Charter Amendments to submit and sign a written proponent ballot argument and  
11 proponent rebuttal ballot argument for submittal to the Director of Elections:

- 12 • To limit hold-over service by members of City boards and commissions whose terms have  
13 expired. (Supervisor McGoldrick)
- 14 • To require the Mayor or four or more members of the Board of Supervisors proposing to  
15 submit an initiative to the voters to submit the measure to the Board of Supervisors first for  
16 a public hearing. (Supervisor Elsbernd)
- 17 • To require the Mayor to appear personally at one regularly-scheduled meeting of the  
18 Board of Supervisors each month to engage in formal policy discussions with members of  
19 the Board and to authorize the Board to adopt rules and guidelines. (Supervisor Daly)
- 20 • To authorize the Board of Supervisors to amend a contract with the Public Employees  
21 Retirement System in order to transfer to the San Francisco Employees' Retirement  
22 System the assets and liabilities of certain airport police officers, and by adding Section  
23 A8.597-10(d) to include time worked as an airport police officer in the calculation for  
24 retirement benefits for police department employees. (Supervisor McGoldrick)
- 25 • To repeal the existing Section 16.109 and to add a new Section 16.109, to renew the  
Library Preservation Fund for fifteen years and to authorize the City and County of San  
Francisco to issue debt for Library purposes secured by and/or repaid from the Fund.  
(Supervisor Peskin)

- To amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco by: amending Sections 8A.100 through 8A.106, 8A.108 through 8A.110, 8A.112 through 8A.113, and A8.404; repealing Section 16.110; re-numbering Sections 16.100 and 16.102 as 8A.114 and 8A.115, respectively and amending Section 8A.115; and requiring the Board of Supervisors to adopt an ordinance amending the Traffic Code to repeal any provision in conflict with this measure and convert such provisions to rules and regulations of the Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors, all to increase the efficiency, effectiveness and autonomy of the Municipal Transportation Agency and to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from San Francisco's transportation sector. (Supervisor Peskin)

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors wishes to authorize the opponents of the following Charter Amendments to submit and sign a written opponent ballot argument and rebuttal ballot argument for submittal to the Director of Elections:

- To limit hold-over service by members of City boards and commissions whose terms have expired. (Supervisor Jew)
- To require the Mayor or four or more members of the Board of Supervisors proposing to submit an initiative to the voters to submit the measure to the Board of Supervisors first for a public hearing. (Supervisors Ammiano, Daly, Mirkarimi, Sandoval)
- To require the Mayor to appear personally at one regularly-scheduled meeting of the Board of Supervisors each month to engage in formal policy discussions with members of the Board and to authorize the Board to adopt rules and guidelines. (Supervisors Alioto-Pier, Dufty, Elsbernd, Jew, Maxwell)
- To repeal the existing Section 16.109 and to add a new Section 16.109, to renew the Library Preservation Fund for fifteen years and to authorize the City and County of San Francisco to issue debt for Library purposes secured by and/or repaid from the Fund.(Supervisors Daly, Jew)
- To authorize the Board of Supervisors to amend a contract with the Public Employees Retirement System in order to transfer to the San Francisco Employees' Retirement System the assets and liabilities of certain airport police officers, and by adding Section A8.597-10(d) to include time worked as an airport police officer in the calculation for retirement benefits for police department employees. (Supervisor Daly)

- To amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco by: amending Sections 8A.100 through 8A.106, 8A.108 through 8A.110, 8A.112 through 8A.113, and A8.404; repealing Section 16.110; re-numbering Sections 16.100 and 16.102 as 8A.114 and 8A.115, respectively and amending Section 8A.115; and requiring the Board of Supervisors to adopt an ordinance amending the Traffic Code to repeal any provision in conflict with this measure and convert such provisions to rules and regulations of the Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors, all to increase the efficiency, effectiveness and autonomy of the Municipal Transportation Agency and to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from San Francisco's transportation sector.

WHEREAS, The Board Member(s) authorized to submit the proponent and opponent ballot arguments, will submit the argument to the Director of Elections no later than the deadline of noon, August 16, 2007, and the respective rebuttal ballot argument no later than noon, August 20, 2007; now, therefore, be it

MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the sponsors and designated opponents of each measure, as listed above, under the provisions of the San Francisco Elections Code Sections 530 and 550, to submit and sign a written proponent and opponent ballot argument and respective rebuttal ballot arguments on their measures; and, be it

FURTHER MOVED, That the sponsors and opponents of measures submitted to the voters for the November 6, 2007 Election, who are authorized by this motion to submit arguments, may authorize or assign to any other person(s) under the provisions of the San Francisco Elections Code Sections 530 and 550 (c) and (d) the right to submit the proponent or opponent's ballot arguments and/or respective rebuttal arguments.
