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7 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco adopted, by Ordinance Nos. 327-98  
8 (Oct. 26, 1998) and 335-98 (Nov. 2, 1998), redevelopment plans for Mission Bay North and  
9 South, respectively, and the Redevelopment Agency of the City and County of San Francisco  
10 entered into owner participation agreements implementing these plans and requiring, among  
11 other things, the development of over 6000 residential units, approximately twenty-nine  
12 percent (29%) of which are permanently affordable; and

13 WHEREAS, On February 1, 2012, the State of California dissolved statewide all  
14 redevelopment agencies and transferred certain obligations and rights to successor agencies,  
15 including the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency of the City and County of San  
16 Francisco (commonly known as the Office of Community Investment and Infrastructure or  
17 "OCII"); and

18 WHEREAS, On January 24, 2014, the California Department of Finance finally and  
19 conclusively approved OCII's request to continue implementing the owner participation  
20 agreements for Mission Bay North and South as "enforceable obligations" and authorized  
21 OCII to fund and develop the number of affordable units allocated under those agreements;

23 WHEREAS, The State of California authorized, by Stats. 2015, ch. 325, Section 9  
24 (codified at Cal. Health & Safety Code Section 34177.7), OCII to issue bonds secured by tax

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1 increment for the purpose, among others, of financing affordable housing required under the  
2 owner participation agreements for Mission Bay North and South; and; now, therefore, be it

3           RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors strongly urges Governor  
4 Newsom and the California Legislature to authorize the Successor Agency to the  
5 Redevelopment Agency of the City and County of San Francisco to use tax increment  
6 financing to increase the amount of affordable housing that it may fund and develop in Mission  
7 Bay South; and, be it

8           FURTHER RESOLVED, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors requests the Clerk of  
9 the Board to submit a copy of this Resolution to the local state legislative representatives and  
10 Governor Newsom.
