RESOLUTION URGING THE TREASURE ISLAND DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY
TO STUDY AND DEVELOP A LIMITED PUBLIC ACCESS PLAN AND REPORT
THE PLAN TO THE COMMITTEE ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT,
TRANSPORTATION AND TECHNOLOGY OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE PASSAGE OF THIS RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, Treasure Island has sweeping vistas of the San Francisco Bay and open areas for pic-nicking, fishing, and other outdoor activities; and

WHEREAS, Public access to these outdoor opportunities on Treasure Island is presently limited due to liability while the island is in transition; and

WHEREAS, Access to Treasure Island is also limited in the evening hours due to public safety risks; and

WHEREAS, In order to address liability and public safety concerns, a Treasure Island public access plan must include adequate monitoring, coordination and security; and

WHEREAS, The Navy currently possesses Treasure Island; and

WHEREAS, Treasure Island is a valuable resource that should be available for safe and limited public enjoyment; and

WHEREAS, A carefully studied and developed public access plan could provide opportunities for the public to safely enjoy the vistas and outdoor recreation on Treasure Island; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the Treasure Island Development Authority to study and develop a public access plan for Treasure Island and report the plan to the Committee on Economic Development, Transportation and Technology of the Board of Supervisors within 30 days of the passage of this resolution.
