THE VACATION AND SALE.

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ORDERING THE SUMMARY VACATION AND SALE OF PORTIONS OF HESTER AVENUE, MAKING FINDINGS PURSUANT TO THE CALIFORNIA STREETS AND HIGHWAYS CODE CHAPTER 4 SECTIONS 8330 ET SEQ. (PUBLIC STREETS, HIGHWAYS, AND SERVICE EASEMENTS VACATION LAW, SUMMARY VACATION), MAKING FINDINGS OF CONFORMITY WITH THE GENERAL PLAN AND PRIORITY POLICES OF PLANNING CODE SECTION 101.1, AND REQUESTING OFFICIAL ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH

Note: This entire section is new.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Findings. (a) The Public Works and Real Estate Departments have requested that the Board of Supervisors vacate and sell portions of Hester Avenue;

- (b) The proposed summary street vacation is necessary to complete sidewalk and retaining wall work in connection with a residential development on Hester Avenue;
- (c) The subject area is shown on the Department of Public Works' drawings SUR-695, SUR-795, and Q-20-439, copies of which are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 990072;
- (d) Section 8334 of the California Streets and Highways Code provides that the legislative body of a local agency may summarily vacate an excess right-of-way of a street or highway that is no longer required for street or highway purposes.

Section 2. The Board of Supervisors finds the portions of Hester Avenue described in Department of Public Works' drawings SUR-695, SUR-795, and Q-20-439, copies of which are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 990072, are excess right-of-way that is no longer required for street or highway purposes. Such portions of Hester Avenue are necessary to complete sidewalk and retaining wall work in connection with

a residential development on Hester Avenue. In addition, the Board finds that no in-place utility facilities exist in the portions of the street that will be affected by the summary vacation.

Section 3. Pursuant to California Streets and Highways Code, Division 9, Part 3, Chapter 4, Sections 8330 et seq. (Public Streets, Highways, and Service Easements Law, Summary Vacation), the Board of Supervisors hereby orders the summary vacation of portions of Hester Avenue as described in the aforementioned drawings. Furthermore, as of the date of recordation of this Ordinance, those portions of Hester Avenue described in the aforementioned drawings will no longer constitute a street or highway.

Section 4. The Board of Supervisors adopts as its own and incorporates by reference as though fully set forth herein the findings of the City Planning Department in its letter dated February 3, 1997 that found the proposed vacation and sale of the subject area in conformity with the City's General Plan and with the Eight Priority Policies of City Planning Code Section 101.1. A copy of such letter is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.

Section 5. The Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Director of Property, on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, to execute a purchase and sale agreement, a quitclaim deed conveying the City's interest in the subject portions of Hester Avenue, and all other documents and instruments necessary to effectuate the vacation and sale of portions of Hester Avenue to the adjacent property owner, Bayside B.H. Development, Inc., copies of which are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.

Section 6. The Board of Supervisors approves and ratifies the sale of the subject portions of Hester Avenue to Bayside B.H. Development, Inc.

Section 7. The Board of Supervisors hereby directs its Clerk to transmit to the Recorder, the Director of Public Works, and the Director of Property, a certified copy of this Ordinance, and such officials are hereby directed to proceed thereafter as required by law.
