## ORDINANCE NO.

1	[SEWER SERVICE CHARGE – RESIDENTIAL HOTEL UNITS.]

3	Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 168-01, which adopted and imposed schedules of sewer		
4	service charges to be paid by users for fiscal year 2001-2002 pursuant to Part II, Chapter X,		
5	Articles 4.1 and 4.2 of the San Francisco Municipal Code (Public Works Code), by providing		
6	that after December 31, 2001, residential hotel units shall be deemed as dwelling units solely		
7	for the purposes of applying and implementing the sewer service charge rules and		
8	regulations.

11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
12	Section 1. Schedule A of Section 5 of Ordinance No. 168-01 is amended to read as follows:		
13	SCHEDULE A. This schedule shall apply to users connected to an individual or a common		
14	water meter whose sewage discharge contains more than fifty percent (50%) wastewater originating		
15	from the result of human habitation in dwelling units, defined herein to be a room or suite of two (2) or		
16	more rooms that is designed for, or is occupied by, one (1) family doing its own cooking therein and		
17	having only one (1) kitchen; or provided, however, that dwelling unit shall not include a boarding		
18	house, motel or hotel as defined in the City Planning Code. After December 31, 2001, residential hotel		
19	units, as defined in Chapter 41 of the San Francisco Administrative Code and rules and regulations		
20	adopted by the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission, shall be deemed dwelling units solely for		
21	purposes of applying and implementing this ordinance. The Board hereby directs the Public Utilities		
22	Commission to develop, adopt and implement rules and regulations by December 31, 2001 necessary to		
23	define and identify residential hotel units not currently subject to regulation under Chapter 41 of the		
24	San Francisco Administrative Code, and to efficiently manage application of Schedule A to residential		
25	hotel units. The rates under this schedule are based upon the typical strengths (parameter loadings) of

as follows:

11	Based upon the above parameters and u	unit costs, all residential users who have not had their
12	flow factor percentage (percentage of water co	onsumption discharged to the sewer) reduced as a result of
13	the Residential Users Appeals Procedure shall	be charged on the basis of water consumption in
14	accordance with the schedule of rates which in	ncludes a flow factor of ninety percent (90%), as follows:
15		
16	LIFELINE RATE	The first 300 cubic feet of water
17		consumption per residential dwelling unit per
18		month shall be charged at the lifeline rate of
19	EXCESS OF LIFELINE RATE	\$1.8623 per 100 cubic feet of water consumption.
20		All water consumption in excess of 300
21		cubic feet per residential dwelling unit per month
22		shall be charged at the rate of \$4.8334 per 100
23		cubic feet of water consumption.
24	Residential users whose flow factor per	rcentages have been reduced as result of the Residential
25	Users Appeals Procedure shall be charged on t	the basis of water consumption in accordance with the

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1	above unit rates, except that the flow factor shall be that determined by the appeals procedure instead of
2	ninety percent (90%).
