AUTHORIZING THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT TO ACCEPT A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$5,000,000 FROM THE STATE BOARD OF CORRECTIONS AND EXPEND THE AMOUNT OF \$910,148 FOR MENTALLY ILL OFFENDER CRIME REDUCTION DEMONSTRATION GRANT.

WHEREAS, Due to the deinstitutionalization of severely mentally ill individuals that occurred in the 1970's, many mentally ill people now remain untreated, resulting in impaired functioning, poverty, homelessness, and self-medication with alcohol and controlled substances; and,

WHEREAS, These behaviors often necessitate police intervention resulting in incarceration and, in some instances, sentencing to state prison; and,

WHEREAS, The State Board of Corrections has made available funding, in accordance with the provisions of Senate Bill 1485 (Article 4 of Chapter 5 of Title 7 of Part 3 of the Penal Code), for development of programs designed to reduce jail crowding, crime and criminal justice costs while addressing the needs of mentally ill offenders during incarceration and upon release; and,

WHEREAS, The 1999-2000 State budget included an allocation of \$5 million to the City and County of San Francisco for the purpose of demonstrating the effectiveness of interventions relating to mentally ill offenders who are likely to be committed to state prison; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors, in Resolution No. 133-99 (File 990340), authorized the Sheriff to submit and sign San Francisco's application for State funding as well as related contracts, amendments, or extensions with the State of California; and,

WHEREAS, A copy of the grant application and contract are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.

WHEREAS, Indirect costs are included at the rate of two percent of the project grant; and,

WHEREAS, The grant proposal identifies hard matching funds consisting of \$987,510 in additional Medi-Cal/Federal funds expected to be generated through the services provided during the grant period; and,

WHEREAS, The proposal also identifies in-kind matching funds in the amount of \$1,311,344; and,

WHEREAS, The \$5,000,000 of State grant funds is allocated for expenditures of \$910,148 in fiscal year 1999-2000, \$1,324,084 in fiscal year 2000-2001, \$1,354,646 in fiscal year 2001-2002, and \$1,411,122 in fiscal year 2002-2003; and

WHEREAS, This grant shall be treated as a continuing grant as defined by Administrative Code Section 10.170, authorizing expenditure of \$910,148 for fiscal year 1999-2000 and providing for the request of expenditure authority in future years through

inclusion in the Annual Appropriation Ordinance each year; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco authorizes Sheriff Michael Hennessey to accept \$5,000,000 from the State Board of Corrections for the Mentally Ill Offender Crime Reduction Demonstration Grant and to expend \$910,148 during fiscal year 1999-2000.
