3	Resolution initiating designation of the Metro Theater, 2055 Union Street, located on
4	the south side of Union Street, encompassing all of Lot 018 in Block 541, as a
5	Landmark pursuant to Section 1004.1 of the San Francisco Planning Code.
6 7	WHEREAS, The Metro Theater located at 2055 Union Street, originally known as the
8	Metropolitan, was opened on 23 April 1924 and is the work of prominent San Francisco
9	architects James and Merritt Reid; and
10	WHEREAS, The Metro Theater, originally the Metropolitan, was built for owner Samuel
11	H. Levin as part of Levin's San Francisco Theatres Inc. chain, which originally consisted of the
12	Alexandria, Coliseum, Metro, Harding, Balboa and Vogue theaters; and
13 14	WHEREAS, The Metro's interior and exterior were remodeled by architect Timothy
15	Pflueger, re-opening on 7 June 1941, as the Metro, and representing a significant part of
16	Pflueger's theater design practice involving the renovation and update of classically inspired
17	theaters of the 1910s and 1920s into the more modern styles of the 30s and early 40s; and
18	WHEREAS, The Metro Theater is an outstanding example of early twentieth century
19	theater architecture, renovated in 1941, that combines elements of the Neo-classical and Art
20	Deco architectural styles; and

23	Francisco International Film Festival, being the first venue for such festival and the site of the
24	festival's Opening Night on 4 December 1957 and subsequent two-week run; now, therefore,

1	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors does hereby initiate the
2	designation of the real property at 2055 Union Street, located on the south side of Union
3	Street encompassing all of Lot 018, in Block 541, including the building located thereon,
4	commonly known as the Metro Theater, as a Landmark, and so refers this resolution to the
5	Landmarks Preservation Advisory for review pursuant to Article 10 of the Planning Code and
6	other applicable provisions of law.
