Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. The Administrative and Health Codes are hereby amended by recodifying Health Code Sections 470.1 and 470.2 as Administrative Code Sections 5.10-1 and 5.10-2, respectively, in Chapter 5, Article X, and revising those Sections, to read as follows:

#### ARTICLE X:

### **FOOD SECURITY TASK FORCE**

SEC. 470.1-5.10-1. ESTABLISHMENT AND MEMBERSHIP OF FOOD SECURITY TASK FORCE.

(a) **Food Security Task Force.** There is hereby established a Food Security Task Force of the City and County of San Francisco. Food security, for purposes of this <u>Article</u> <u>Xordinance</u>, shall mean the state in which all persons obtain a nutritionally adequate, culturally acceptable diet at all times through local non-emergency sources.

- (b) **Membership.** The Task Force shall consist of *up to 15* <u>20</u> members <u>appointed by the Board of Supervisors, City department heads, or the San Francisco Unified School District,</u> as provided below. Members, other than department representatives and the School District representative, shall serve at the pleasure of <u>their respective appointing authorities</u> the Board of Supervisors.
- (1) Departmental and School District Representatives. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint one member from the
- (1) Seat 1 shall be an employee of the Department of Human Services, appointed by the Executive Director of the Human Services Agency. of the Human Service Agency,
- (2) <u>Seat 2 shall be an employee of</u> the Department of Public Health- Nutrition Services, <u>appointed by the Director of Health.</u>
- (3) Seat 3 shall be held by an employee of the Department of Aging and Adult Services of the Human Services Agency, appointed by the Executive Director of the Human Services Agency.
- (4) Seat 4 shall be held by an employee of the Department of Public Health Food Security, —Office of Food Systems, appointed by the Director of Health.
- (5) Seat 5 shall be held by an employee of the Department of Children, Youth and their Families, appointed by the Director of the Department of Children, Youth and their Families.
- (6) Seat 6 shall be held by an employee of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, appointed by the Director of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing.
- (7) Seat 7 shall be held by an employee of the and the Department of Environment

  Recreation and Park Department's Urban Agriculture Program, appointed by the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department.

- (8) Seat 8 shall be held by an appointee of the The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors
  shall invite the San Francisco Unified School District if the District chooses to appoint a member to
  submit a representative for appointment by the Board as a member of the Task Force.
- (9) (2) In addition, the Board may appoint as members of the Task Force up to eight Seats 9 through 19 shall be held by representatives of community-based organizations that provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco residents, nominated by the Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Such community members shall be nominated by the Task Force and These members may include but are not limited to representatives from organizations serving food in the following program types: homedelivered meals; congregate meals for seniors; food bank; free dining room; multi-service agency serving families and youth; shelter meals; and faith-based organizations; food retail (farmers markets; grocery stores); and hospital and health clinics and a member of the public. No organization shall have more than one representative on the Task Force.
- (10) Seat 20 shall be held by a member of the public, nominated by the Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
- (c) **Staffing.** The Department of Public Health shall provide clerical assistance and logistical support to the Task Force and its committees.
  - (d) **Meetings.** The Task Force shall meet at least once every four months.
- (e) **Purposes of Task Force; Strategic Plan.** The Food Security Task Force shall recommend to the Board of Supervisors legislative action and city-wide strategies that would

increase participation in federally funded programs such as Cal Fresh known nationally as SNAP and formally as food stamps, Summer Food Service, the Child and Adult Care Food Program, the Homeless Children Nutrition Program, the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC), the School Lunch Program, and the National School Breakfast Program. The Task Force shall also provide general advice and assistance to the Board of Supervisors with regard to funding priorities, legislative action, and Ceity policies on addressing hunger and enhancing the food security of San Francisco residents in addition to any other issues within the Task Force's expertise.

To accomplish these goals, the Food Security Task Force shall prepare an annual assessment of the state of hunger and food insecurity in San Francisco. *The report may include with* recommendations for funding, programs, and policy. The Task Force shall submit the hunger and food insecurity assessment to the Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors may adopt legislation to implement the recommendations.

Thereafter, the Task Force shall submit status reports on progress toward implementing the plan and meeting the plan's goals to the Board bi-annually.

#### SEC. 470.2 5.10-2. SUNSET.

Unless the Board of Supervisors by ordinance extends the term of the Task Force, *Sections 470.1 and 470.2 this Article X* shall expire by operation of law, and the Task Force shall terminate, on July 1, *2018 2021*. After that date, the City Attorney shall cause *Sections 470.1 and 470.2 this Article X* to be removed from the *Health Administrative* Code.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the

ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

Notwithstanding the Effective Date of this ordinance, it is the intent of this Board that the Task Force shall continue to operate without interruption and that the incumbent members of the Task Force shall continue to hold their seats without reappointment unless removed by the appointing authorities designated in this ordinance.

Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the ordinance. However, as stated at the beginning of Section 1, this ordinance recodifies Health Code Sections 470.1 and 470.2 as Administrative Code Sections 5.10-1 and 5.10-2, which has the effect of deleting those sections from the Health Code.

## **LEGISLATIVE DIGEST**

[Administrative, Health Codes - Food Security Task Force]

Ordinance amending the Administrative and Health Codes to change the composition of the Food Security Task Force and to extend the sunset date of the Task Force by three years to July 1, 2021.

## Existing Law

The Food Security Task Force is a 15-member advisory body that makes recommendations to the Board of Supervisors to increase participation in federally-funded food security programs. The Task Force also provides general advice and assistance to the Board regarding funding priorities, legislative action, and City policies on addressing hunger and enhancing the food security of San Francisco residents. In 2013, the Board of Supervisors enacted Resolution No. 447-13, committing to ensure that all San Franciscans are food secure and hunger free by 2020.

The Board of Supervisors appoints 14 members of the Task Force, including six City employees. The San Francisco Unified School District appoints one member.

The Task Force will sunset and cease to exist in July 2018 unless the Board extends the Task Force by ordinance.

#### Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would change the composition of the Task Force by adding five members—one employee of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, and four representatives of community organizations. The ordinance would also authorize City department heads to appoint the members of the Task Force representing their departments.

Finally, the ordinance would extend the sunset date of the Task Force to July 2021.
