WHEREAS, Lawrence Ferlinghetti is a poet, playwright, painter, internationally-acclaimed publisher and activist, who is best known for his prominent voice in the "wide-open" poetry movement and as a foundational figure in the establishment of the Beat movement;

WHEREAS, Mr. Ferlinghetti was born in Bronxville, New York, on March 24, 1919, to Carlo Ferlinghetti, an immigrant from Brescia, Italy, and Clemence Mendes-Monsanto; and

WHEREAS, While serving in the U.S. Navy during World War II, Mr. Ferlinghetti adopted a lifelong commitment to pacifism and anti-war activism after witnessing first-hand the action at the Normandy invasion and, later, the horrific aftermath of the atomic bomb that obliterated Nagasaki; and

WHEREAS, After returning from his service, Mr. Ferlinghetti continued his academic career and, in 1947, received a Master's degree in English Literature from Columbia University and, in 1950, a Doctorate de l'Université de Paris (Sorbonne); and

WHEREAS, Mr. Ferlinghetti pursued his passion in literature and moved to San Francisco where he co-founded City Lights Bookstore in 1953, the first all-paperback bookstore in the country that later became an international literary gathering place for writers, readers, artists, and intellectuals; and

WHEREAS, In 1956, after the sale of Allen Ginsberg's "Howl and Other Poems" to an undercover police officer, Mr. Ferlinghetti was arrested and charged with the sale of obscene material; and

WHEREAS, The ensuing affirmation of Mr. Ferlinghetti's First Amendment Rights in a court of law helped established a legal precedent that strengthened the stature of City Lights Publishers and invigorated the community's ongoing battle against censorship of controversial works; and

WHEREAS, Over the course of his esteemed career, Mr. Ferlinghetti's influence expanded into the international literary and arts scene, earning him numerous international awards and coming full circle when, in 1998, he was declared San Francisco's Poet Laureate; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Ferlinghetti's paintings have been displayed in galleries and museums around the world, including the Smithsonian Museum of American Arts, the Fine Arts Museum of San Francisco, Centre Pompidou in Paris, and Museo di Roma in Trastevere, Italy; and

WHEREAS, As the centennial of his birth looms, Mr. Ferlinghetti continues to energize the international arts and literary world by blurring the boundaries between social justice advocacy, literature and art, constantly challenging the status quo and demanding that we "create works capable of answering the challenge of apocalyptic times"; and

WHEREAS, On Sunday, March 24, 2019, City Lights Booksellers and Publishers will celebrate the life and legacy of its founder on the day of Mr. Lawrence Ferlinghetti's one-hundredth birthday; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco recognizes Mr. Lawrence Ferlinghetti for his inspiring lifetime of contributions to the literature and arts community of the world and proclaims March 24, 2019, as Lawrence Ferlinghetti Day in the City and County of San Francisco.
