[Urging DPH and DHS to protect workers at MSC-North and MSC-South]

Resolution urging the Departments of Public Health and Human Services, and the Mayor's Office on Homelessness to protect workers at MSC-North and MSC-South.

WHEREAS, as part of the broader vision being undertaken by City's emergency services system for adults who are homeless, the Department of Human Services, the Department of Public Health and the Mayor's Office on Homelessness have issued Request for Proposals (RFPs) for Emergency Shelter Services at Multi-Service Center- North (MSC-North and Multi-Service Center-South, (MSC-South); and

WHEREAS, the Office and Professional Employees International Union (OPEIU), Local 3, represents and 100 workers of these two homeless shelters and has had collective bargaining agreements with both Episcopal Community Services and St. Vincent de Paul, the contracting agencies for MSC-North and MSC-South, respectiveley, for almost ten years; and,

WHEREAS, OPEIU Local 3 has been a part of the ongoing discussions and the preparation of the RFPs for the purposes of ensuring that their members' jobs and livelihoods would be protected; and,

WHEREAS, the RFPs that were finally issued, on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein, made no requests of the potential contractors to give provisions towards the retention and training of the employees of MSC-North and MSC-South; and,

WHEREAS, the only mention of the fact that these employees have a union is in a footnote of Section II, D, Subsection (e) (I); and,

WHEREAS, the majority of these workers are formerly homeless individuals; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the City of San Francisco's interest that these workers' employment does not get terminated with the possibility of a new contractor; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of Human Services, the Department of Public Health, along with the Mayor's Office on Homelessness, to ensure that the contractor for social services at MSC-North and MSC-South be required to retain and retrain the current workers; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the above named Departments to ensure that the new contractor accepts the terms and conditions currently guaranteed by the collective bargaining agreement between OPEIU Local 3 and the present contractors, Episcopal Community Services and St. Vincent de Paul.
