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Motion appointing Chris Callandrillo, term ending November 23, 2008, to the Shelter

Monitoring Committee, residency requirement waived.

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MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby appoint the hereinafter designated person to serve as a member of the Shelter Monitoring Committee, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 283-04 and Article XII of Article 20 of the San Francisco Administrative Code, for the terms specified:

Chris Callandrillo, succeeding Diana Valentine, resigned, seat 3, must have experience providing direct services to the homeless through a community setting, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending November 23, 2008; and, be it

FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- The membership of the Shelter Monitoring Committee has a goal to be representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- Applicant Chris Callandrillo, a new appointee, who is not a resident of San Francisco, is a
 person with experience that uniquely qualifies him to serve on the Shelter Monitoring
 Committee.
 - 3. The Shelter Monitoring Committee has attempted to fill the position, for which Chris Callandrillo was nominated, with an individual who is a City resident and who has the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this time.
- The Rules Committee has certified that Chris Callandrillo is qualified to serve on the Shelter Monitoring Committee.
- After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is no other
 possible representative, who is a resident of San Francisco and who has the specific

3	FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement

5	can be found, pursuant to Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires person(s) appointed
6	to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of
7	Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
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
