

1 [Administrative Code - Reentry Council - Eligibility Age Change]

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3 **Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to change the eligibility age for one of**
 4 **the seven former inmate members appointed to the Reentry Council by the Mayor from**
 5 **ages 18 to 24 to ages 18 to 35, and to require that that inmate member have been an**
 6 **inmate before the age of 24.**

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12 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

13 Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising Section 5.1-3, to
 14 read as follows:

15 **SEC. 5.1-3. MEMBERSHIP AND ORGANIZATION.**

16 (a) **Members.** The Council shall consist of 24 members, seven of whom shall be
 17 former inmates in the San Francisco County Jail, a California Department of Corrections and
 18 Rehabilitation adult facility, and/or a United States Bureau of Prison facility. The Mayor, or ~~his~~
 19 the Mayor's designee, shall serve as a member, and shall also appoint three of these seven
 20 members. Of these three members, at least one must be between the ages of 18 to ~~24~~ 35 at
 21 the time of appointment and have been an inmate before the age of 24, and at least one shall have
 22 expertise in providing services to individuals exiting the criminal justice system. The Board of
 23 Supervisors shall designate one of its members to serve as a member of the Council, and
 24 shall appoint the other four of the seven members who are former inmates. Of these four
 25 members, at least one shall have expertise in providing services to individuals ~~existing~~exiting

1 the criminal justice system, at least one must have been released from custody within three
2 years of his or her appointment, at least one must have served multiple terms of incarceration,
3 and at least one must self-identify as a survivor of violence or crime. All members of the
4 Council shall be exempt from the Charter requirement that they be electors of the City and
5 County of San Francisco.

6 The following City departments or agencies shall appoint one member each to the
7 Council: the Public Defender’s Office, the District Attorney’s Office, the Sheriff’s Department,
8 the Police Department, the Adult Probation Department, the Juvenile Probation Department,
9 the Department of Economic and Workforce Development, the Human Services Agency, the
10 Department of Children Youth and Families, the Department of Public Health, and the
11 Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing. In addition, Council co-chairs shall
12 invite the San Francisco Superior Court, the Department of Child Support Services, the
13 California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation Division of Adult Parole Operations,
14 and the United States Probation and Pretrial Services System to appoint one member each to
15 the Council. If any of these four agencies does not appoint a representative, the Council co-
16 chairs shall appoint an additional member.

17 Members shall serve two-year terms and shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing
18 authority. Members may serve multiple terms.

20 Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
21 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
22 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
23 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor’s veto of the ordinance.

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1 Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
2 intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
3 numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
4 Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
5 additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
6 the official title of the ordinance.
