To the Honorable Board of Supervisors:

I respectfully request you consider me for appointment to the Board of Supervisor's Neighborhood Representative Seat on the Entertainment Commission. A native of Baltimore, Maryland, I moved to San Francisco in 1994 after graduating from law school. San Francisco attracted me at least in part by its vibrant entertainment scene and its unique neighborhoods. Like most San Franciscans love the City and cannot imagine living anywhere else.

I have long been involved in volunteer activities. As I settled into San Francisco, I became increasingly interested in local and neighborhood issues. I am particularly interested in promoting open space and parks, traffic calming, reducing unnecessary noise, and other quality of life issues.

I was one of the original members of the Friends of Victoria Manalo Draves Park and represented the neighborhood on the Construction Review Committee once construction began. Currently, I live in Corona Heights, where I am working with a number of other residents in forming a Friends of Corona Heights Park Group. Our initial focus is drafting a grant application for funding under the Community Opportunity Fund Program. I am a trained member of Castro Community on Patrol and I recently served on the Roosevelt Way Traffic Calming Working Group. I also belong to the Buena Vista Neighborhood Association.

As an individual interested in neighborhood issues, I believe those who operate street fairs and entertainment venues must show respect to the individuals and families who live in the affected communities. Though I live in a non-commercial neighborhood now, for over ten years I lived in the heart of the Castro and for several years lived directly behind 1015 Folsom. Thus, I have an understanding of what it is like to live in close proximity to entertainment venues and understand the impact such venues have on a neighborhood. While I recognize the tension between neighborhoods and entertainment providers, I do not believe their interests are directly in opposition. I believe respect, cooperation, and moderation can lead to entertainment that enhances rather than detracts from neighborhoods.

I would be a valuable asset to the Commission. As a licensed attorney, I bring a broad understanding of the law. I have spoken before the Commission during public comment periods a few of times and I am keenly interested in its work. I attend Commission meetings from time to time simply to stay abreast of the issues.

I have the support of Supervisor Wiener, and I am able to provide further references. I would gladly make myself available to meet with you at your request and convenience.

Broad-Based Community Organizer - I have been involved in the Gay Rights Movement since 1984. In Pittsburgh, PA, I oversaw the genesis of several queer advocacy groups: Queer Nation Pittsburgh, ACT Up Pittsburgh, and Queers Against War. In 1990, I was elected Secretary for Queer Nation NYC and was an active member of ACT Up. Since 1997, when I moved to San Francisco, my efforts to organize within the community have evolved from organizing protests during the AIDS crisis to promoting active civic engagement. I currently hold the E-Board Community Outreach position for the Harvey Milk LGBT Democratic Club, with an emphasis on membership and political outreach. I was also recently awarded the Simeon White Volunteer of the Year award, an honor accompanied by a commendation by the San Francisco Board of Supervisors. My forward-thinking advocacy for issues within the community was also well-received during my 2010 run for District 6 Supervisor, where I not only helped change the course of the dialogue on homelessness, nightlife and drug policy but was also endorsed by The Bay Guardian, Manor Advocates, Alliance for a Better District 6, Gays of District 6, Central City Democrats, TACPAC, League of Pissed Off Voters and received a second place endorsement from both District 6 Supervisor Jane Kim and Rafael Mandelman.

Along those lines, earlier this year I was called upon to organize the community response to the putative closing of the Eagle Tavern in SOMA. This establishment had raised over 3 million dollars for community organizations and been a mainstay in the LGBT community for 30 years. Although ultimately unsuccessful, our efforts brought unparalleled awareness via local news stations and internet groups to a broader cross

section of San Francisco about what these venues have contributed not only to Queer communities but to the city as a whole. We were fortunate enough to have broad political support behind our efforts as well: State Senator Mark Leno, Supervisors Jane Kim, Scott Weiner, David Campos and former Supervisor Bevan Dufty. In the future, there can only be more positive outcomes for the community in this regard.

Broad-Based Community Organizer - I have been involved in the Gay Rights Movement since 1984. In Pittsburgh, PA, I oversaw the genesis of several queer advocacy groups: Queer Nation Pittsburgh, ACT Up Pittsburgh, and Queers Against War. In 1990, I was elected Secretary for Queer Nation NYC and was an active member of ACT Up. Since 1997, when I moved to San Francisco, my efforts to organize within the community have evolved from organizing protests during the AIDS crisis to promoting active civic engagement. I currently hold the E-Board Community Outreach position for the Harvey Milk LGBT Democratic Club, with an emphasis on membership and political outreach. I was also recently awarded the Simeon White Volunteer of the Year award, an honor accompanied by a commendation by the San Francisco Board of Supervisors. My forward-thinking advocacy for issues within the community was also well-received during my 2010 run for District 6 Supervisor, where I not only helped change the course of the dialogue on homelessness, nightlife and drug policy but was also endorsed by The Bay Guardian, Manor Advocates, Alliance for a Better District 6, Gays of District 6, Central City Democrats, TACPAC, League of Pissed Off Voters and received a second place endorsement from both District 6 Supervisor Jane Kim and Rafael Mandelman.

I view entertainment venues as an underappreciated resource for fundraising and engaging the community in a dialogue for social change. In a time of uncertainty and drastic budgetary cutbacks, I'm-working with entertainment venues to continue to help not-for-profits raise money and awareness, enhance civic minded-discourse and behavior of individuals, as well as protect the interests of San Francisco's poorest residents. Entertainment can be part of the solution to many of our city's outstanding problems if managed correctly and if an open dialogue can be created between the Entertainment business community and the community at large. Along those lines, earlier this year I was called upon to organize the community response to the putative closing of the Eagle Tavern in SOMA. This establishment had raised over 3 million dollars for community organizations and been a mainstay in the LGBT community for 30 years. Although ultimately unsuccessful, our efforts brought unparalleled awareness via local news stations and internet groups to a broader cross

section of San Francisco about what these venues have contributed not only to Queer communities but to the city as a whole. We were fortunate enough to have broad political support behind our efforts as well: State Senator Mark Leno, Supervisors Jane Kim, Scott Weiner, David Campos and former Supervisor Bevan Dufty. In the future, there can only be more positive outcomes for the community in this regard.

I think this is an example of what happens when you are a Drag Queen guite frankly. People look at you and believe that you can not be taken seriously or that perhaps I will not be able to make decisions that will be fair.

I will really need your help on the 7th to testify to the Rules Committee that I

1. Community Oriented and that clubs are often the place that queers find their voice and become leaders. As a person who escaped to NY I had one way to make a living and serve my community. Drag. Drag was my only job in NY. In San Francisco however I became a hairdresser and made my living as such. I did drag as a way to continue my storytelling and art. I have continued to work for the community around planning issues that I later was Sainted by the Sisters for, I have worked around Prop 8 and other anti queer legislation. But it is not just "I" who have done it but we have together. Out of the bars and into the streets as Harvey Milk said.

2. Last year I ran for Supervisor of District 6 and came in 6th out of 15. I struggled to gain recognition in a crowded field and to make my platform heard. A platform based on community solutions for some of our toughest problems. I continue to work around Safe Use Sights and Homeless issues while using my drag to fundraise for many grass roots and not for profit organizations. I have also done an exemplary job with the Harvey Milk Club as their Outreach Co-Ordinator and even won the Simeon White Volunteer of the Year award this year.

3. I have to try three times as hard as anyone else. When people see you as a drag queen it is very hard to be taken seriously. I know that and proudly bring my culture with me anyway. I find the strength to do this because of the support my community offers. I have not quit but continued to work harder so as to not stop the forward momentum we have experienced together.

We must continue to maintain that voice together. We do have a vested interest in community building and creating opportunities for the community to grow as a whole. (Or to steal Pippi Lovestocking's line "I like to serve the community as a

4. Since my run for Supervisor I have be recruited by many not for profits to sit on their governing boards. I have chosen The United Playaz and the Shi Yu-Lang YMCA because they deal with Youth. I have started learning land use this month by joining the Western SOMA Citizens Task Force because I understand the importance of Planning in our city and creating vibrant communities that work.

5. I have volunteered or fundraised for hundreds of organizations. I participate in the Castro and Folsom fairs because I find it an honor to be a part of our rich cultural heritage. I do it with my friends because we believe in giving back to our city and our community. I want neighborhood parties not to overwhelm the community. Our city needs to help organize around large events like Street Fairs and Pride to maximize local talent and handle the crowds by offering an array of events throughout the city.

I care deeply about San Francisco and our communities so much so that I will proudly face the disparaging remarks made by others so that we continue to find a voice and representation in City Hall. Please join me in this fight.

Board Qualifications:

The Entertainment Commission shall consist of 7 members comprised of 3 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors and 4 members nominated by the Mayor.

Each nomination by the Mayor shall be subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors and shall be the subject of a public hearing and vote within 60 days. If the Board of Supervisors fails to act on a mayoral nomination within 60 days of the date the nomination is transmitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the nominee shall be deemed approved.

Of the 4 members nominated by the Mayor, the Mayor shall nominate one member to represent the interests of City neighborhood associations or groups, one member to represent the interests of entertainment associations or groups, one member to represent the interests of the urban planning community, and one member to represent the interests of the law enforcement community.

Of the 3 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors, one member shall represent the interests of City neighborhood associations or groups, one member shall represent the interests of entertainment associations or groups and one member shall represent the interests of the public health community.

To stagger the terms the initial appointments to the commission shall be as follows: the Mayor nominates two members to serve terms of four years, one member to serve a term of three years

Dear Decision Makers,

It has come to my attention that the Entertainment Commission and Rules Committee is considering replacing Jim Meko after his term expires. I understand Glendon Hyde/Anna Conda is in consideration for the Neighborhood Representative Entertainment Commission seat. I understand Anna Conda has been an advocate for homeless, LGBT, marriage equality and is an entertainment bonanza. I've enjoyed her shows on a few occasions myself. I believe he may be a good appointment to represent the interests of entertainment association groups, but not the neighborhood representative. There should be equal representation on the commission and this would most certainly upset this required balance.

I don't know Jim personally, but my interaction with him as the leader of the SoMa Leadership Council and as an Entertainment Commission Neighborhood Representative has left me with the one impression that you always want when you seek answers or guidance for quality of living issues — <u>COMPLETE FAIRNESS!!</u> You won't always get you want, but you can count on this fact - all parties involved, even the perceived trouble makers, will get a fair shake to address whatever issue needs to be addressed.

I reside at 766 Harrison Street which happens to be the neighbor to the Manor West club on 750 Harrison Street. I purchased a home at 766 Harrison Street in 2009 and after the club reopened under their existing name, Manor West, the thumping bass sound emitted from the club was unbearable in the evening hours. At times you could not hear your TV clearly, you could feel the vibration on the walls and hear bass through the ventilation shafts of the building. There is a building (SOMA Mental Health Center) in between the club and 766 Harrison. I tried to approach the club owners for months and was ridiculed by staff. Unfortunately I had to contact the Entertainment Commission for guidance. The Commission invited the club owners and myself to participate in their agenda so both sides could present their case. To make a long story short both parties were educated to understand that we were both part of the neighborhood and that we needed to co-exist. The bass emission from the club has been lowered and the owners of the club gave us their numbers if for some reason the bass level ever became uncomfortable. The situation is night and day compared to what it used to be. We have the entertainment

commission, but mostly Jim Meko, to thank for this quality of living improvement!

Please understand this situation is far from perfect. For the past two months the bass sound has been getting louder. When the club is called they respond immediately, but if this continues to happen it will kind of defeat the purpose of having this option. The club also has frequent crowd management issues with patrons vomiting, smoking and creating noise right outside under the windows of 766 Harrison Street along with blocking sidewalk access. Coincidentally last weekend, Justin Rojas, nice guy and the president of the commission, was spotted entering the club (at 12:40PM on Saturday) while this was occurring and nothing was done about it. I think he was mostly concerned with having a good time. Don't blame him, Manor West is a swanky club, but it proves that a neighborhood representative or TWO is needed on the Entertainment Commission! We will continue to work with our neighbors to try to make sure the situation works for everyone. This is what Jim Meko has taught us!

This is just one example of a group of residents and a business that have been touched by Jims dedication to the community he serves. I'm sure there are many many more. It's no wonder that he was the 2010 recipient of the Mayor's Office of Neighborhood Services' NEN Lifetime Achievement Award. He has been serving the community for years and knows what he is doing. I'm am proud to support Jim Meko for the entertainment commission neighborhood representative seat.

Thank you for considering the reappointment of Jim Meko at the July 7 meeting of the Rules Committee.



Dear Rules Committee,

My name is Austin Phillips, and I've lived in District 6 since 2007. I strongly support the reappointment of Jim Meko to the Entertainment Commission. I currently hold a seat in the Parks, Recreation and Open Space Advisory Committee but have been a dormant member due to a change in my work schedule. However, I am writing today as a concerned resident and supporter of Jim Meko.

As someone who once lived *above* a bar in SOMA -- which anyone who has lived in SF for any length of time would realize that there are many many people who live either adjacent to or in the same building of a bar or nightclub or other entertainment venue -- I understand what it's like to need and deserve fair representation with my bar and nightclub neighbors.

Board Qualifications:

The Entertainment Commission shall consist of 7 members comprised of 3 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors and 4 members nominated by the Mayor.

Each nomination by the Mayor shall be subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors and shall be the subject of a public hearing and vote within 60 days. If the Board of Supervisors fails to act on a mayoral nomination within 60 days of the date the nomination is transmitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the nominee shall be deemed approved.

Of the 4 members nominated by the Mayor, the Mayor shall nominate one member to represent the interests of City neighborhood associations or groups, one member to represent the interests of entertainment associations or groups, one member to represent the interests of the urban planning community, and one member to represent the interests of the law enforcement community.

Of the 3 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors, one member shall represent the interests of City neighborhood associations or groups, one member shall represent the interests of entertainment associations or groups and one member shall represent the interests of the public health community.

To stagger the terms the initial appointments to the commission shall be as follows: the Mayor nominates two members to serve terms of four years, one member to serve a term of three years

and one member to serve a term of two years. Of the three remaining members, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint one member to serve a term of four years, one member to serve a term of three years and one member to serve a term of two years. All terms of initial appointees to the commission shall be deemed to commence upon the same date which shall be the date upon which the last of the seven initial appointees assumes office. Thereafter, all appointments and reappointments shall be for a term of four years.

The Entertainment Commission shall: 1) assist entertainment organizers and operators to apply for necessary permits; 2) promote responsible conduct; 3) promote the City's entertainment industry; 4) promote the use of City facilities; 5) foster harm reduction policies; 6) develop "good neighbor policies"; 7) mediate disputes between persons affected by entertainment events and establishments and the operators of such establishments; 8) issue entertainment related permits; 9) plan and coordinate City services for major events; 10) provide information regarding venues and services appropriate for events and functions ancillary to conventions.

Reports: Prepare and submit to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors within one year from July 6, 2002 and not less than five years thereafter a report analyzing the commission's effectiveness. Prepare and submit to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors an annual report by March 1st regarding its activities for the preceding year. Prepare and submit to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors within one year from July 6, 2002 and annually thereafter a report analyzing fee revenue.
